The Presiding Bishop has appointed Logan Crews to be a virtual member of his delegation to the **United Nation's 28th Conference of Parties to the Framework Convention on Climate Change meeting** November 30-December 12th. Referred to as COP28, the conference will be in Dubai this year.

This concludes Logan's term as an Episcopal Church Ecojustice Fellow. He is now moving into a new fellowship with the Yale University's Center for Environmental Justice along side his work as a new student at Yale and Berkeley Divinity Schools. The entire Crews family is proud of Logan's accomplishments and so are we!
