From the Curate: Welcoming The Center for the Eucharist

A few weeks ago I wrote a short article on practicing hospitality, and encouraged us to consider what forms our hospitality might take if we pattern it on the hospitality God models in the Incarnation, when the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.

One way we practice hospitality at Emmanuel is to welcome "outside" groups to use our facilities. We have had numerous organizations meet here over the years, some religious in nature and some not. Some are here for a set period of time, like the Lewis and Clark Summer Institute. Some have long-term, ongoing programs that meet here, like the various recovery and support groups that use our downstairs community room.

Recently Emmanuel also extended building space and hospitality to a new venture called the **Center for the Eucharist**. The Center's director, the Rev. Ralph McMichael, Ph.D., now has an office established in one of the third-floor rooms in Jones Hall. Fr. McMichael has been an Episcopal priest for 28 years, having served as a parish priest, a seminary professor (at Nashotah House), and, most recently, as Dean of the Episcopal School for Ministry and Canon for Ministry Formation in our diocese. Some of you might remember Fr. McMichael from an Adult Forum presentation he led last spring on Eucharistic spirituality. I was privileged to serve as a reader for the manuscript of his most recent book, entitled *The Eucharist: A Guide for the Perplexed*, which was published this summer.

If you're interested in learning more about the Center, I would encourage you to visit their website, www.eucharistcenter.org. The mission of the Center focuses on "the transformation and renewal of all dimensions of the Christian church, life, and faith...by developing and fostering leadership, teaching, and practices that reflect and fulfill the comprehensive vision bestowed on followers of Jesus within the Celebration of the Eucharist."

In other words, the Center's purpose is to remind churches and individuals that the center of our faith is the Eucharist,

and then to challenge, encourage, according to that starting point through offering workshops, curricula.

In his blog on the Center's website, Fr. McMichael offers regular reflections on the theme of Eucharistic renewal and transformation. In a post entitled "Why the Center for the Eucharist?" he ultimately gives this answer: "Because every generation of the church and all Christians are called to return in remembrance and beckoned forward in expectation by the Lord's command: 'Do this in remembrance of me."

I am grateful for the work of the Center and happy that our parish is able to offer hospitality to it in the form of building space and a welcoming environment. As a member of the Center's Board of Directors, I am also happy to speak to anyone with questions about the Center and its mission. I believe it will be an enriching, even life-giving gift to the Church and to the world.

Junior High mission trip presentation to Adult Forum, Sunday, October 10

Adult Forum: Ourselves, Our Parish, Our Church, Our World

The Adult Forum will continue to look at issues that affect us as individuals, as Episcopalians, and as God's hands and feet in the world. On **September 26**, Dan Appleyard will lead an informational presentation and discussion about issues currently facing the **Episcopal Church and Anglican Communion**. Our denomination has been much in the news over the past months and Dan will help sort out what's going on.

On October 3, we turn inward and continue exploring self-image, especially of children and women. "Healthy Eating in a Spiritual Context" will be the topic at the Oct. 3 Adult Forum. We will welcome Dr. Randy Flanery, a clinical psychologist who works with patients at McCallum Place. Did you know that this internationally acclaimed program for the treatment of eating disorders is located in Webster Groves? Following that, mission is the focus on October 10. The Junior High will give a presentation about their mission trip to Moundridge near Steelville, Missouri and the Environmental Committee will continue to help us learn more about what we can do to be good stewards of God's creation.

The Adult Forum steering committee is expanding its scope and will begin to offer small group study opportunities at different times of the week. Emmanuel Women's Book Club

Monday night, September 27 at 7:00 pm., Emmanuel Women's Book Club will resume our fall schedule with John MacArthur's controversial book <u>Twelve Extraordinary Women</u>. Coming up on October 25, we will take on historical-fiction, Biblical style, with Elissa Elliotts' **Eve: A Novel of the First Woman.** Elliott imagines the story of Adam and Eve as told by Eve and her daughters: Naava, the beautiful weaver; Aya, the quick-witted, club-footed cook; and Dara, the compassionate observant twin. Eve recounts "The Fall" and how she and Adam wandered until settling down to grow crops, raise livestock, and start a garden of their own. The novel departs from lushly imagined story telling and thrusts the family into the unfamiliar territory of meeting city dwellers. Elliott makes biblical fiction her own with a female perspective that emphasizes emotional turmoil, sensual experience, and an impressive range of imagery that brings to life Biblical daily life.
