# Secrets from the Sacristy: Advent Colors and the Sarum Rite

December is here, and Emmanuel's lovely Advent Wreath is once again suspended above the chancel during the four weeks of Advent. Each of the purple and pink candles will be lit in succession, week by week, until they are replaced by the four white candles of Christmas. We are all comfortable seeing the purple and pink of Advent in various liturgical settings, but have you noticed how some of those once-purple clergy vestments have lost all sense of lavender? Look again

this Sunday....they're not purple....they're "Sarum Blue"!

"Sarum" is the abbreviation for *Sarisburium*, the Latin name for Salisbury, the ancient English town known both for its magnificent cathedral and for the prominence of its bishops and liturgy since the Church of England's earliest days. According to customs developed at Salisbury Cathedral, blue was the proper color for the season of Advent, representing hope, expectation, confidence, and anticipation.

Roman Catholics outside of Britain used purple during both Advent and Lent, since it represented humility, penance, and wisdom derived from inward reflection. Thus, when blue dye became prohibitively expensive to produce during the late-Middle Ages, less wealthy English parishes substituted purple during Advent. This later tradition persisted in the Anglican Church, primarily since it also coincided with Roman rite customs used virtually everywhere else.

After the English Reformation, the Church of England adopted much of the Salisbury Cathedral liturgy. However, since the Book of Common Prayer never dictated liturgical colors, most Anglicans just continued using the more familiar Roman Catholic colors. In recent years, traditional Anglican liturgists have challenged this "custom of convenience," championing the return of "Sarum Blue" to symbolize the proper qualities for Advent.

Thus, Emmanuel joins Episcopal and Anglican parishes throughout the world in returning to the ancient traditions of Sarum, and we're carrying on a long-standing tradition as we mix various old, new, and ancient styles of worship.

# Parish Nurse Notes:Practice Healthy Habits During Flu Season!

If you are sick, stay home! If you have flu-like symptoms (fever with cough or sore throat), stay home for at least 24hours after you are free of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications.

# If your children are sick, keep them home, too! Children are more vulnerable to the 2009 H1N1 strain than to other commonly circulating flu viruses. It is now the predominant strain around the world. Children should also stay home for *at least* 24 hours after they are free of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications.

Cover your cough! Cover your mouth and nose with a disposable tissue when you cough or sneeze.

Throw the tissue in the trash after you are finished, and immediately wash your hands or use an alcohol hand sanitizing gel (60% or higher alcohol content). Cough or sneeze into the crook of your elbow if no tissue is available.

Wash your hands. Wash them frequently. Use soap and water. Lather up well, and sing "the alphabet song" (once) or "row-row-row your boat" (three times) to yourself, to make sure you wash them long enough. Use friction, rinse well, then dry well. Good hand hygiene is one of the best defenses against getting or spreading any form of influenza. As stated above, a gel hand sanitizer is also effective.

**Get immunized.** Get both the seasonal flu vaccine, and the 2009 H1N1 flu vaccine, if recommended (see below for more info on most vulnerable groups).

**Try to avoid close contact with sick people.** Visit by phone, or take extra precautions.

# College School and Thanksgiving Day Ingathering Support Food Center

It was a wonderful day when The College School students pulled their red wagons from the school, located several blocks east on Big Bend, to Emmanuel with 3,890 cans of food for Emmanuel's Emergency Food Center!

The children were accompanied by teachers, parents and a minivan filled with food. As they arrived the children passed the cans of food like a water-bucket brigade, one to the other, until all 3,890 cans were in the dining room. More than twenty Emmanuel members helped organize the food by category and then took the cans into the Food Center to shelve.

The enthusiasm of the children is wonderful to see, and parents and adults are caught up with this tradition of feeding the hungry. As the children sat on the church steps waiting for the final count of cans, I talked to one mother who told me her 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade daughter woke up the previous morning, as excited as though it was Christmas, and shouted "It's Wagon Train Day" and was a bit disappointed to find it was the following day. The mother then told me that on the correct day, her daughter was up and dressed for school by 6:30 a.m.

The Thanksgiving Day service at Emmanuel, where we are joined by our friends from Christ Lutheran Church, brings another outpouring of gifts of food for the Center. Checks are very much appreciated, too, as all the cans of food are given out by the end of February. This year's cash gifts totaled \$917. Everyone who reads this knows there are people in our area having financial problems, and the Food Center is a place where we try to fulfill our mission to help feed the hungry. On behalf of those we serve, thank you for your generosity. Please remember that hunger never takes a holiday; support our Food Center year round.

# Legislation Extends Tax-Free Gifts from IRAs

Congress recently extended the ability to make qualified distributions totaling up to \$100,000 per year from a traditional individual retirement account (IRA) or Roth IRA to qualified charities through 2009 without including the distribution in your income. You may find the following information helpful in your gift and tax planning:

- The gift must be distributed directly from your IRA administrator to a qualified charity, such as Emmanuel Episcopal Church. Contact Nancy Benz in the parish office for more information about how to do this.
- You must be at least 70 ½ years of age when the qualified charitable distribution is made.
- Through 2009, you may make tax-free transfers from your IRA to a charity totaling up to \$100,000 in each year. You may give to more than one charity as long as your total IRA charitable roll-over gifts during the same year do not exceed the \$100,000 limitation. If you are married, your spouse may also be eligible to make such gifts up

- to \$100,000 from her/his own IRA.
- A gift from your IRA counts towards your minimum annual distribution requirement.
- The distribution is excluded from your income.
   Although you cannot deduct the gift on your income tax return, the distribution is not reported as income so there is no adverse income tax effect.
- IRA assets may not be used to fund a gift annuity, charitable remainder trust, a donor advised fund, or private foundation.
- This law applies only to IRA accounts (either traditional or Roth). Other plans, including 401(k) or 403(b) plans, do not qualify.
- Although this distribution is excluded from income for <u>federal</u> income tax purposes, you will want to check on your state law to determine if the distribution amount may still be included for <u>state</u> income tax purposes.

Be sure you discuss this with your tax and legal advisors.
