Talking with Children and Teens about the Tragedy in Haiti

With news about the catastrophic effects of the earthquake in Haiti all over the media, parents might well find themselves feeling a bit overwhelmed by questions like, "*How do I talk to my child about this?*" or "*How do I help my child feel safe?*"

With permission, we've downloaded two resources dealing with this issue and put them up on our website: you'll find links on our homepage. In the mean time, some key points that might be useful are included below. As one Christian Formation resource puts it, "It is important to talk to the children in our churches about the devastation in ways that do not negate the reality of the death and destruction and yet help them to know that this is not an act of God against the people of Haiti. The God of love does not destroy life"

Here then, are suggestions from LeaderResources:
***First and foremost, children need to be assured that they are safe.** Children often experience anxiety, fear, and a personal sense of risk. *Limit television viewing for younger children, especially those of preschool age.* It is very difficult for young children to process images and messages in news reports. Let children know that tragic events are not our everyday experience and that the adults who love them will always try to take care of them.

***Be aware of where your child is developmentally.** Preschool children may see death as reversible, temporary or impersonal. Children between ages 5-9 are beginning to realize that death is permanent but may still think they could escape through their own ingenuity or efforts. From age 9 or 10 through

adolescence, children begin comprehending fully that death is irreversible, that all living things, die, and they too will die some day.

***Find a way to participate in relief efforts.** Help your children by making a conscious choice to take part in caring for others and helping where you can. Doing something concrete helps us feel like we are part of the solution and it is a definitive statement of hope and rebirth.

***Consider spending some family time praying for the people who have been hurt or died.** Talk to God about not understanding why this happened.

***Don't hesitate to contact members of the clergy or educational staff at your church if you want further information or just to talk.**

Prayers and assistance for the people of Haiti

As you know by now, a catastrophic earthquake struck Haiti's capital, Port-au-Prince, on January 12. At least three million people are estimated to have been affected, innumerable homes have been destroyed and major structures have been damaged, including the Diocese of Haiti's headquarters.

Our Presiding Bishop has requested our prayers and assistance to the people of Haiti. "The people of Haiti have suffered a devastating earthquake, and it is already clear that many have died and many more are injured. Even under "normal" circumstances, Haiti struggles to care for her 9 million people. The nation is the poorest in the western hemisphere, and this latest disaster will set back many recent efforts at development. I urge your prayers for those who have died, been injured, and are searching for loved ones – and I urge your concrete and immediate prayers in the form of contributions to Episcopal Relief & Development, who are already working with the Diocese of Haiti to send aid where it is most needed."

Episcopal Relief & Development is in contact with the Diocese of Haiti to both address immediate needs and prepare for long-term rehabilitation work. **Your help is critical in providing life-saving services and emergency supplies** such as medicine, food and water, as well as long-term support for the country's ongoing recovery and rebuilding efforts in the days to come. *If you'd like to join with the Emmanuel family in responding to this need, you can send a check to the parish office ASAP, payable to "Emmanuel Church" and noted "Haiti ERD".* A series of checks from the parish will be sent to ERD over the next several weeks. The total amount of donations collected by the parish will be reported in the pre-Lenten edition of Reaching Out, which should arrive in your (e) mail boxes in early February.

Building Update

With a much-needed break in the weather, construction activity will focus on getting the new building under roof and water-tight in the coming weeks. Interior finishing work cannot begin until the building is water tight. The sequence of work is non-negotiable: certain things must happen before subsequent work can begin. The roof will go on first; once that is completed, the window openings will be covered with plastic until glass can be installed. Following that, work on the masonry stone on all three sides of the exterior walls will begin on the 1st floor level; and finally exterior doors will be installed. The hope is that despite the weather in February, interior finishing can commence.

Despite construction delays caused by bad weather, important work has continued in the area of planning. A Building Use Committee consisting of staff, clergy, vestry and ministry chairs was formed in late November and has been meeting regularly to assign building space for Sunday morning Christian formation (Faith Quest, youth groups, Bible study), meeting spaces during the week (Vestry, Book Club, Prayer Shawl Ministry, 12-step groups) and office space. Once space usage was nailed down, the committee addressed how rooms in the new space will be furnished, based on how the space will be used and by whom – as well as the ever-important cost considerations. Special thanks to Sara Canavan for sharing her design expertise, Clark Hotaling and Mimi Shipp for their assistance with furniture, and to Anne Crown, Pamela Dolan, Jennifer Dunn, Angie MacBryde, and Rita Rundquist for helping with decisions about the new nursery space.

Baptismal Instruction on February 2: Sign up by January 27

Tuesday, February 2, will be Emmanuel's next baptismal preparation session. There won't be another session until March 23, so if you'd like your child baptized before then, be sure to register for the February class. If you would like to attend, *please contact Susie Feldmann in the parish office by January 27 to enroll* (961-2393). There is no cost to attend.

At least one parent must attend an evening session before their child can be baptized at Emmanuel. Grandparents are also invited, and Godparents are strongly encouraged to attend. You do not have to set a baptismal date to come to a session. If you are pregnant or still deciding about baptizing



your child here, please come to one of these sessions. They are a wonderful opportunity to learn more about baptism and to explore raising your child as a Christian, as well as a chance to get to know other parents in the parish.

The preparation sessions begin with dinner at 6:00 p.m. Childcare will be available. Sessions run about 2½ hours. You need not attend the session closest to your child's baptismal date, just choose one that works with your schedule and is prior to the day you want to have your child baptized.
