Hymn Sing for Haiti

Even before the earthquake, visitors to Haiti had hearts touched hearing hymns sung by the faithful. Now, amid rubble and uncertainty, hymns continue to waft over the tent cities and places of refuge; a people's response of prayer and determination. The Diocese of Haiti is the largest diocese in the Episcopal Church, and she has lost a cathedral, a convent, schools that educated 80,000 children, colleges, and churches; she has lost parishioners. But the people of Haiti have not lost faith. To gather and sing is a profoundly affirming and hopeful act, in times of celebration and in times of need.

Please join us for a *Hymn Sing for Haiti*, Sunday, February 28, 4:00 pm., at Christ Church Cathedral (1210 Locust, St. Louis). We'll be singing from the hymnal that Episcopalians here and in Haiti share. We'll also sing hymns from *Lift Every Voice and Sing II*, and from the rich tradition of our brothers and sisters around Christ's Church; songs from Presbyterian, Methodist, UCC, Baptist, Catholic hymnals. We invite you to bring a beloved hymn from your tradition.

A free-will offering will be taken to support the work of Episcopal Relief and Development, currently on the ground in Haiti and the Dominican Republic.

On Tuesday, March 2, we'll have an opportunity to learn more about Haiti through our "Creative Christianity" series:

The mention of Haiti conjures up images of rumble and death. What do you really know about the people of Haiti? They are more than victims. What characterizes the culture that was shaken but not destroyed? What are we praying will one day be restored? Join us as we look at the colorful, whimsical arts of Haiti. Participate in the ancient art of storytelling and meet the folkloric characters every Haitian knows. Try your hand at the excess of their decorative arts. How did the Virgin Mary get into a voodoo ceremony? What can we learn from the passionate spirituality of people who witnessed to the power of Papa God from under the rubble?



LENT BEGINS

The Ash Wednesday exhortation calls us “to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting and meditation on God’s Holy Word.” We observe the Lenten discipline individually and as a community through fellowship, study, prayer, fasting, almsgiving, self-examination and confession.

Why not try a “Carbon Fast” this Lent?

As Christians we have a responsibility to be wise stewards of God’s Creation, and each of us must decide how we can improve our stewardship to safeguard God’s Creation now and for future generations. A list of 40 carbon fasting actions everyone can consider as a part of your Lenten preparation for the Easter season is posted on Emmanuel's website on the "Stewardship" page. Each of these actions will reduce our production of climate change pollution and help to preserve God’s great gift of Creation.

Friday Morning Eucharist in Lent: Make time for worship and fellowship during the week

February means Lent this year and a return to our traditional Friday morning Eucharist during Lent. On February 19 through March 26 we will celebrate Holy Eucharist at 7:00 a.m. in the church, followed by a delicious breakfast prepared by the Men of Emmanuel and fellowship time in the dining room.

These early morning services are a wonderful piece of any Lenten discipline, and you won’t find a better breakfast deal anywhere. You can come by on your way to work and start your weekend in a holy, restful manner. Make Friday morning Eucharist a part of your work week during Lent. Join us – and invite a friend!

Thursday and Friday Morning Prayer services coming to an end

After over 30 years of dedication and devotion, our practice of offering Morning Prayer on Thursday and Friday mornings will come to an end. Emmanuel’s Adult Forum during Lent: Spirituality for the New Millennium

In his recent book *Finding Our Way Again: The Return of the Ancient Practices*, Brian McLaren writes that “the postmodern era can best be characterized by a search for spirituality, a word that somehow captures this idea of a viable, sustainable, meaningful way of life. The word *spirituality* tries to capture that fusion of everyday sacredness. For many people, it represents a life-giving alternative to secular fundamentalism and religious fundamentalism, the former offering the world weapons of mass destruction and the latter stirring emotions to put the suicidal machinery into motion.”

During Lent, Adult Forum will be exploring some of the ways that people in our church and community are returning to ancient practices and finding new life in them. We’ll look at how it really is possible to be both spiritual *and* religious, and we hope to hear from you about whether any of these practices resonate in your own life. You might even come away an idea for a new habit you’d like to develop, in Lent and beyond.

Join us in the dining room on Sunday mornings. We start with fellowship and announcements at 10:15, with our program beginning at 10:30 and finishing up by 11:15 a.m.

Our first topic will be Contemplative Prayer, a presentation offered by the Rev. Rod Wiltse on February 21. Then we’ll hear from Don Esbenshade about the Community of Hope, a “monastery without walls,” on Sunday, February 28. Future topics will include Ignatian spirituality and Living a Eucharistic Life.

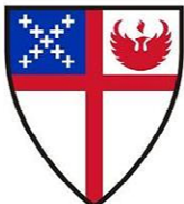

New Coordinator named for "Martha's Meals" Ministry

One of our fine old traditions is being recreated, renewed and refreshed. *Martha's Meals* is a network of parishioners who are willing to provide a hot supper for parents of a newborn, someone just home after surgery, or someone just not strong enough to manage in the kitchen yet. These meals are delivered to your door for anywhere from one evening to a week or two, depending on the need. Coordination is the key to the success of this program.

As you know, we have been looking for a new "Martha" who will do the telephoning necessary to match the need and the service. We have found her! We are delighted to announce that Eleanor Fletcher has agreed to coordinate and communicate for this helpful program. She will be calling those who have cooked these meals for years, as well as some folks who have not tried this before. Eleanor will explain that one need not be a gourmet cook and that the meals need not be elaborate. **Now is the perfect time to sign up again or for the first time.** Young adults, men and newcomers are underrepresented in the group. We would be especially happy to see the names of these folks on the list posted in the parish hall.
