### Adult Forum Preview for November

Do you know the difference between a will and a trust? You can, if you join us for Adult Forum on **November 13**. The **Planned Giving** Committee is pleased to welcome Debbie Champion, founding partner in the firm of Rynearson Suess Schnurbusch and Champion, as our Forum speaker. Ms. Champion is a recipient of an Outstanding Volunteer Award from Legal Services of Eastern Missouri and the Missouri Pro Bono Publico Award from the Missouri Bar Association. She was recently honored by the Women's Law Caucus of Washington University for her commitment to the advancement of women in the law. She often presents educational seminars to clients and to the legal community on topic a variety of topics. During her time with us, Ms. Champion will focus on the basic of estate planning, including wills, trusts, power of attorney, and medical directives. Please join us for this very important presentation.

Remember a few weeks ago when the world was supposed to end? So how come we're all still here? On **November 20**, we will explore the concept popularly known as "**The Rapture**". As we approach the end of the Church Year and the beginning of Advent, our readings are filled with images of the End Times. In our time it is hard to hear such readings without thinking of the popular cultural evangelical novels by Tim LaHaye, the *Left Behind* series. But, this is a recent and new theological phenomena for Christianity, dating back only to the 19th century. During Forum, our rector Dan Appleyard will take a look at the rise of this perspective in the evangelical Christian community as well as looking at older Jewish and Christian perspectives of the End Times.

We often say that Mission Trips change lives, and this is as true for our youth missioners as for adults. One sure sign of this is the **young adult mission trip to Guatemala** that took place this past May. Alumni of our senior high international mission trip took it upon themselves to plan and execute a mission trip on their own, which was a huge success. On **November 27**, members of the team will spend part of their Thanksgiving break joining us, so that they can share with their Emmanuel family some of the highlights of the trip, including a slide show and personal reflections. We will also be able to welcome a representative of **God's Child project** here that day. You won't want to miss this inspiring presentation.

### FROM THE VESTRY

### A Fall Afternoon with Our Family

On a recent Sunday, Emmanuel's Senior High Youth Group did yard work at Ann Marie Ruhlin's house. Kim and I were fortunate enough to "come out of the bullpen" as youth leaders for the day. There was a gentle breeze and ideal temperatures. Under Ann Marie's direction, we went through the yard trying to distinguish "bad" honeysuckle from "good" itea. We pulled up "bad" vinca (except where it was "good" vinca!). A drainage bed was repaired. Leaves were raked, weeds pulled, sidewalks swept. There were yummy brownies and ice cold sodas, compliments of Ann Marie. Youth and leaders – twenty or so – were having fun while doing work! Some youth – like our Alli – had known the Ruhlins for life, while others met Ann Marie for the first time. And importantly that day, a lost and dear keepsake was discovered in the yard by one of our youth and returned to Ann Marie.

As I looked around, seeing our youth spruce things up, I had memories of a fall day in 1996. Following a two year work stint in DC, we moved back to Webster. We had chosen our house – in need of more than a little TLC – because of its location ... because of what Emmanuel had meant to us before the move. Our Emmanuel family did not disappoint. A common sight around church was someone holding a Tappana kiddo – as an aunt or uncle would – and making us feel as if we had never left. And our Emmanuel family got together and gave us a yard party for our housewarming. So on a beautiful fall Saturday, we worked up a dirty sweat having fun with our "family" – twenty or so – to pull out unwanted overgrowth and tidy up what remained. Our Emmanuel family – complete with shovels, rakes, gloves and even a pickup and a chain - worked tirelessly that day to make a long neglected yard a whole lot better. But, more importantly, they lent an outstretched Emmanuel hand ... they showed their care. Two church family members who showed their care so wonderfully that fall day fifteen years ago were Ann Marie & Andy Ruhlin.

Seasons change. Emmanuel family, friendship, community ... and faith ... don't.

### **Vestry Vitals**

At this month's vestry meeting, we did not have our regular reflection due to a schedule mix-up. So, we moved directly into our agenda, focusing on two primary subjects: first, money, and then—oh, yeah, second, money. It is that time of the year, after all. Diana Rasmussen-Knapp gave the Treasurer's report for Bill Florent. Income continues to run slightly ahead of budget, and expenses are pretty much in line with budget—so, at this point, our financial situation is fairly solid. The Behold campaign continues to wind down. We have currently collected about 92% of pledges. As I mentioned last month, the vestry is exploring the possibility of refinancing the loan we have with the Diocese.

The second money issue we discussed was the Fall Campaign and the current pledge drive. As we enter the first week in November, we have collected approximately two thirds of the outstanding pledges. In the coming weeks, the vestry and the Finance committee will be working to balance our pledges with our 2012 budget. If you have not yet submitted your pledge card, please do so as soon as possible so that the difficult work of balancing the budget can proceed.

We at Emmanuel have been blessed abundantly everyday in so many ways—your prayers and support are much appreciated.

### FROM THE CURATE: PRAY WITHOUT CEASING

1<sup>st</sup> Thessalonians 5:17 may be one of the most intimidating lines in the Bible: "Pray without ceasing." It is hard to imagine how such a thing could be possible. Doesn't St. Paul understand that we have work to do, bills to pay, families to raise, email to read, Facebook statuses to update?

Well, email and Facebook might be new ones to him, but I think St. Paul understood perfectly well how complex and busy life can be. And it is precisely because of this deep understanding of human life and limitations that his advice is so profound: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

At Emmanuel we offer many opportunities for corporate prayer, as part of our regular worship—on Sundays, of course, but also at our noon Eucharist on Wednesday and at Morning Prayer on Tuesdays. We have also added a new opportunity for you to explore prayer in a more intimate way, something that we hope will help you grow in your own prayer life outside of church.

Once a month (on the second Tuesday) we will be offering Contemplative Prayer on Tuesday night in the chapel. These sessions began in October; the next one will be held on December 13. You do not have to know what you are doing in order to attend; in fact, we hope you will try it out even if you have never heard of contemplative prayer before! It takes approximately half an hour and consists mostly of silence, interspersed with a series of meditations.

The silence is probably the most important part, and the part that will perhaps, with practice, become most meaningful to you. It can in fact become the thing you yearn for, the thing that leads you to more and more prayer in your daily life. Esther de Waal, a gifted explorer of the spiritual life, writes about "the tremendous existential silence of God which nobody has ever been able to explain and which is, nevertheless, the heart of all that is real." She goes on to quote Thomas Merton:

Only the everlasting silence in things is real: for it is the silence of God, buried in their very substance, singing the song which he alone can hear.

(from Silence in Heaven, quoted in Lost in Wonder by Esther de Waal)

As many of you know by now, I am about to enter into a time of transition, which means that prayer, silence, and gratitude will be even more important than usual. So I will conclude simply with another line from 1<sup>st</sup> Thessalonians, a line that sums up so much of my time here: "We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ."

### **Environmental Stewardship**

"Give us all a reverence for the earth as your own creation, that we may use its resources rightly in the service of others and to your honor and glory." (The Prayers of the People; BCP pg 388)

The parish family gets a big thank you for supporting environmental stewardship efforts! By now you have probably noticed the recycle bins and signs throughout the church buildings. Since it is "single stream recycling" you don't have to do any sorting – just toss anything recyclable into one of the blue bins. Although Webster Groves does not accept plastic #6, the church's waste management accepts all plastics, even #6. (If the items are soiled from food, please rinse them out.)

And for the ultimate recycling – compost! If you are preparing food in the church kitchen you can toss any compostable food scraps into one of the labeled buckets and the Environmental Stewardship Committee will turn them into lovely rich compost for gardening. You can compost fruit and vegetable scraps, coffee grounds, even tea bags and coffee filters (just **no meat or dairy**).

### **Thanksgiving Day Service and Food Center Ingathering**

Our annual Thanksgiving Day celebration – Holy Eucharist with Food Center Ingathering — begins at 9:00 a.m. We will be joined again this year by our brothers and sisters from Christ Lutheran Church, and their pastors, the Revs. Keith and Penny Holtse. As an outward expression of our thanksgiving for all of God's blessings, the congregation is invited to bring canned goods and cash gifts for our Food Center. During the service, we will have an opportunity to place them on the altar. Immediately after the service, volunteers are invited to stay and help bring the food to the dining room for sorting, counting and carrying to the Food Center.

Donated food should be non-perishable, such as canned vegetables, fruits, soups, stews and tuna fish. Especially welcome are peanut butter, jelly, breakfast cereal and canned pasta. Checks are also very welcome, and should be made payable to Emmanuel Church and noted "Food Center." Cash gifts maintain our food inventory long after the food collected on Thanksgiving Day is gone.

Emmanuel's Food Center is funded solely through contributions and special gifts. It is not included in Emmanuel's general operating budget. Through your generosity, the Food Center annually provides over 1,600 individuals with a three-day emergency supply of food. In addition, the Food Center funds the Operation Brown Bag Program with several Emmanuel groups preparing lunches for distribution to the homeless in St. Louis. As you see your grocery bills increase, please remember same thing is happening to the Food Center's grocery bills.
