Dear Friends,

In a Christmas edition of the Abbey Letter, Abbot Andrew wrote: "Jesus, as the exemplar for all people, is exemplary in balancing masculine and feminine principles in his personality. He had no qualms about throwing the money changers out of the temple, and he had no problem expressing his motherly affection for Jerusalem by shedding tears and speaking of himself as a hen gathering her chicks under her wings..."

All of us are called to follow this example of Christ's life. Even St. Paul, who was as aggressive a missionary as the church has ever seen, also spoke of himself as "a mother feeding and looking after her own children", when he spoke of his life in the Church.

Abbot Andrew's comments challenged me. And, the image of Mary and Martha - the image of one who sits and listens versus one who works - continues to challenge me the most. How do I balance "my Mary and my Martha" - my spiritual being and my doing? How can I best be vulnerable and at the same time "get the job done"? How do I make space for "the tears of Christ" and for God's proclamation of a "mission for righteous living"?



As the season of Epiphany comes to a close this week and we move into the season of Lent, perhaps we could all be challenged by this "balancing act" that God calls us into. The former season speaks of Jesus' mission and the latter season calls us to spiritual disciplines. Together they call us at Emmanuel to grow deeper in our faith and to strive to serve those in need evermore faithfully - for we are all called to follow the example of Christ. And, that example is rich with "tears" and "proclamations" It is a call to mission and a call to listen!

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## Vestry Vitals

The Emmanuel Vestry met for our annual retreat the weekend of February 10-11. This tradition of meeting for a longer than normal meeting period allows us to get to know one another through sharing meals and telling our stories. It is a good time for new vestry members to ask questions and understand the role your vestry takes in leadership in the parish & goal setting for the coming year.

Our work this year produced great dialog around hospitality and welcoming, and even as one person put it, the hospitality and welcoming is the Episcopal way to evangelize! We also delved into financial reports and a detailed report from AIR. As you recall from Annual Meeting we have a balanced budget but, in order to sustain staffing and programs, we need to elevate the pledge income beginning next year.

We walked away with very broad goals of hospitality; AIR and stewardship, and an overarching goal of communicating well. We also talked about how each of us has been touched in some way at some point and thus we are here at Emmanuel on a journey, spiritual or otherwise. The 'How', 'What', 'Who' touched us to 'be' at Emmanuel varies greatly. But the one constant is that someone reached out to welcome, to console, to teach, to expose a struggle, to share, to smile, to listen.....the list goes on.

Each of your vestry members will work on one of the goals. Expect to see them more visibly at various activities, and expect them to reach out to you as we all share the essence of Emmanuel with each other and our broader community. The result of each of us reaching out is an inclusive community, a welcoming community and a vibrant, relevant community based on The Word of God.

I encourage everyone to think about the question we all answered.....What is the essential characteristic of Emmanuel to you? Feel free to share your thoughts/ experiences with a vestry member! An appropriate topic as we enter into this Lenten season.

## 2012 Lenten Programs

### **Tuesday Nights Lenten Series from February 28 to March 27 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.**

Come for a potluck at 6:00 p.m. and then break into hour-long small groups. We'll conclude the evening with Compline (a brief prayer service) at 7:45 p.m. This is an opportunity to strengthen the ties of fellowship that bind us, while learning something new and contributing your own ideas and insights to the community.



#### **Four Small Group Topics Are:**

##### **(1) Via Media Values—Baptismal Ethics in Action.**

Part of an educational series call Via Media, produced by Episcopalians, this series is designed to guide people deeper into putting their beliefs to work. It is focused on the implications and manifestations of the beliefs that are expressed in the Baptismal Covenant and how we might take our faith into the world. It has been produced to tell the story of our faith in a way that invites participants into discussion and mutual discovery.

The sessions include the following topics:

- Repentance, an Ethical Journey;
- Witness, an Ethical Example;
- Service, an Ethical Imperative;
- Respect, an Ethical Right; and
- Go Forth, Ethics in Action.

There will be take home handouts and reflections that invite reflection as you go forth in the name of Christ.

##### **(2) Parenting Reflection & Prayer Rescheduled for Wednesdays—2/29, 3/7, 3/14 & 3/28 - at 6:00 p.m.**

Join us for the second annual Parenting Workshop Series during Lent. The Workshop is open to anyone parenting kids of any ages. The Workshop agenda will be driven by the interests of the participants: the first week we will have a round-table discussion and develop a list of priority topics for the following weeks. The Workshop will be moderated by a different volunteer from the group each week. Topics may include integrating prayer life into family life, discipline, incorporating values through example, building awareness of money management, etc. Please come with topics that are important to you - it is certain others are interested too!

The Workshop format will be a relaxed and open discussion starting with problem solving, followed by a discussion on the topic of the week, and closed with a prayer circle.

##### **(3) Contemplative Prayer**

Contemplative prayer is a spiritual practice which frees us to experience God's love by setting aside a time and space to be open to the presence of God. In this place, God can invite us to come and to sit, to quiet our exterior and interior life, and to simply be with God. As we sit in God's presence, we become like the tree planted by streams of water; our roots grow down deeply into God's love for us.

In God's presence our life and identity become rooted in the unconditional love of God, rather than in the roles we play or in the measures of our society. God invites us to remain in the stillness of His presence, letting our heart roots drink deeply from the water.

One of the significant fruits of contemplative prayer is love and genuine compassion for others. "The root of Christian love is not the will to love, but the faith that one is loved...by God" (Thomas Merton in *New Seeds of Contemplation*, p. 75). Out of the awareness that we are loved by God we are enabled to love as we are loved.

Join us to learn about the different traditions in Christianity of Contemplative Prayer and to set aside time to practice it. The Reverends Warren Crews and Rod Wiltse will lead these sessions.

## 2012 Lenten Programs

### 4) Stations of the Cross

For anyone who is interested in using the stations as a format for Lenten reflections or who plans to participate in the Good Friday Stations of the Cross, this introduction may be useful.

Week 1 - History of the Stations of the Cross. A presentation by John Snodgrass and Deacon Burnell Esbenschade

Week 2 - A Comparison of the Accounts of the Anointing of Jesus in all four Gospels by Sandy Cooper that considers the context of this event, the drama of the event, and who learns and who teaches in this event.

Week 3 - Images from the Cross. Visit the Stations of the Cross, contemplate, think and respond by creating a simple visual reflection. Each person will fill a cross with an image that responds to the message. Images may be simple fields of color, shapes, abstract or expressive or realistic and literal. All the supplies you need will be provided for you. Presentation by Anne Constantinescu-Brad, a working artist and a teacher who is known for her work with children of immigrants and refugees.

Week 4 - A Comparison of the Stations Events in the Synoptic Gospel Accounts. A presentation by Dr. Ron Crown

Week 5 - Walking the Stations in the Sanctuary

## Ingathering Begins on February 26 for Shoeman Water Projects

Perhaps you have seen the signs at Porter Paints or Plowsharing Crafts that indicate they are drop-off points for the Shoeman. What is the Shoeman Project?



Shoeman Water Projects is a ministry of Eagle Wings Ministries, a registered [501\(c\)\(3\)](#) non-profit [charity](#), working to alleviate as much human suffering as possible and in the process, maximize fun with a splashing good time. Shoeman Water Projects picks up donated used and new shoes year round from businesses, churches, schools, and shoe drives. Once collected, the shoes are given a second life when the Shoeman exports the donated shoes to retailers in the developing world. The resale of shoes provides jobs and affordable footwear. Funds generated from the export of shoes provides well drilling rigs, water purification systems, and hand pump repair micro businesses bringing clean, fresh water to those who thirst.

Since 1998, Shoeman Water Projects founder George, the Shoeman, Hutchings, has visited Kenya repeatedly, shipping a sizable quantity of supplies including 21,000 meals for orphans, \$2 million in medical supplies, dental labs, neurosurgeons for pediatric facial reconstructions. In August of 2008 George began Shoeman Water Projects to specifically focus on clean drinking water. In his decade prior travel to Kenya he had discerned that without clean water, all other aid would be a momentary stop-gap.

From August of 2008 through June of 2011 Shoeman Water Projects has collected over 1.5 million pairs of shoes that have become affordable shoes for those in need of protection from abrasions and deadly parasites as well as clean drinking water. The Sole Power of donated shoes collected by George and his team at Shoeman Water Projects has, thus far, resulted in the purchase of 4 water-well drilling rigs, more than 250 wells drilled serving more than 200,000 people, as well as water purification system installations and well pump repairs serving clinics, schools and villages across the globe. !

St. John's-Tower Grove sponsors a free Peace Meal, open to all, every Saturday from 4 to 6 p.m. The Peace Meal Project needs people to help staff, cook, and serve meals. The food and recipes are provided, along with a person to lead the team. Teams should have 4 or more people and should expect to help with a meal every 8 weeks or so. Everyone involved is encouraged to take a break and eat/mingle at some point.

No experience necessary! Each team or participating organization has a main contact person (Kevin McGrane for Emmanuel) who is in charge of coordinating its team. There are also opportunities for individuals to help with the meals in addition to teams. Workers show up at 2 p.m. on their scheduled day and if the same people are cooking, setting up, serving, and cleaning up, they will likely need to be there until 6:30 p.m. or 7 p.m. Teams are welcome to involve more people and divide the work.

## **An Inquirers' Class: "The Episcopal Church for *Dummies*" Beginning on February 27**

**Join us for Five Weeks of Learning and Fellowship  
Confirmation, Reception and Reaffirm your Baptism, April 15**

Our Inquirer's Class is an unimposing introduction to the Church. Regardless of how long we have been Christians or members of a particular church, there is always more to learn. It is also a perfect place to reencounter our faith. After all, many of us find it true that at different stages of our life the same information or story we've heard before will strike us in a new way, leading to new insights and discoveries.

In the *Book of Common Prayer*, on page 308, we hear the following words during Baptism: "Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works."

With that understanding of "inquirer" in mind, please consider yourself invited to our Inquirers' Class, beginning on Sunday, February 27. We will meet at 11:30 for about an hour and a half; lunch is included and child care can be provided (please sign up in advance if you need child care). You will not have to buy any books or do any homework, just bring yourself, your questions and concerns, and an open mind (and maybe even a discerning heart!).

Whether you are new to Emmanuel, new to the Episcopal Church, new to Christianity--or none of the above!--your questions and your perspective will be welcomed and honored. In this class we will all strive to learn from one another, while covering the basic core beliefs held by the Episcopal Church on topics such as the nature of God, the role of Scripture, what we mean by the sacraments, and more.

When the Bishop visits in April he will be offering confirmation, reception, and reaffirmation to eligible adults. This class will serve as required preparation for those rites (your clergy are happy to discuss eligibility), but is not restricted to those individuals who wish to participate in them. You can come to the class just to explore; there will be no pressure to be confirmed, received, or anything else! (And yes, we'll even explain all those terms during the class.)

Please **sign up for the class** on the sheet in the narthex (the entry area inside the main entrance) and let us know if you'll need child care. 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
## **Conversations about Racism**
