Vestry Vitals

Each of our vestry meetings begins, this year, with a reflection by a vestry member. These reflections can be something from the Bible, something from the Book of Common Prayer, a poem, an excerpt from a novel—whatever. They are meant simply to be something that is meaningful to the person who chose it. We will print these reflections each month here as part of the Vestry Vitals column. I was elected to go first; so at last month's meeting I chose to read two pieces—one a poem, the other a meditation--that show, among other things, two different views of our involvement in human suffering or tragedy.

Musee des Beaux Arts by W.H. Auden

About suffering they were never wrong, The Old Masters: how well they understood Its human position; how it takes place While someone else is eating or opening a window or just walking dully along; How, when the aged are reverently, passionately waiting For the miraculous birth, there always must be Children who did not specially want it to happen, skating On a pond at the edge of the wood: They never forgot That even the dreadful martyrdom must run its course Anyhow in a corner, some untidy spot Where the dogs go on with their doggy life and the torturer's horse Scratches its innocent behind on a tree.

In Brueghel's Icarus, for instance: how everything turns away Quite leisurely from the disaster; the ploughman may Have heard the splash, the forsaken cry, But for him it was not an important failure; The sun shone As it had to on the white legs disappearing into the green Water; and the expensive delicate ship that must have seen Something amazing, a boy falling out of the sky, Had somewhere to get to and sailed calmly on. (Another Time, 1940)

And then:

Meditation XVII, by John Donne

No man is an Island, entire of itself; every man is a piece of the Continent, a part of the main; if a clod be washed away by the sea, Europe is the less, as well as if a promontory were, as well as if a manor of thy friends or of thine own were;

any man's death diminishes me, because I am involved in Mankind; And therefore never send to know for whom the bell tolls; It tolls for thee.

As I said, we will reprint the reflections each month here in this space.

Now on to other issues. As I mentioned in last month's Vestry Vitals, the Vestry identified a number of issues and goals they were committed to working on during the coming year, and I promised to communicate these to you. Before I do, however, let me stress that the Vestry recognizes that there are, in many cases, fully functioning groups at Emmanuel already addressing these issues and are well underway with superb leadership. The Vestry has simply said that these are priority items that, as a Vestry, we want to hold up and recognize as issues of prime importance to our lives at Emmanuel.

With that said, let me focus in this issue on those items the Vestry categorized under the heading of

"Enhance Financial Health."

- 1. Increase Awareness of Financial Situation: a coordinated effort among the EMC chairs, Vestry members, Treasurer, and Finance Committee. This group will make recommendations to the Vestry, Rector, Treasurer, and Finance Committee of ways to communicate the parish's financial situation to the congregation on an ongoing basis, maintaining a balance between financial and spiritual perspectives. Clark Hotaling will be the Vestry coordinator.
- 2. **Compensation and Benefits**: a subcommittee with representation from the Vestry, Finance Committee, and Personnel Committee will examine our current compensation and benefits package with a goal of determining its equitability or whether better alternatives exist, all keeping in mind our budgetary constraints. Gary Tappana will be the Vestry coordinator.
- 3. **Increase Operating Revenue**: members of the Vestry and Finance Committee will explore a variety of ideas that seek to open new sources of revenue for the parish. Karl Reif will be the Vestry coordinator.
- 4. **Planned Giving:** the Vestry representative, Bob Feldmann, will work closely with the existing subcommittee headed by Ida Early to further the goal of increasing the parish's awareness of the Emmanuel Foundation and ways to consider including the Foundation in your estate.
- 5. **Counting System**: this group will examine both possible alternatives to our current counting system as well as ways we might improve the current system, all with the goal of providing consistent, reliable, secure methods of handling money collected during the services, while at the same time minimizing the burden on the counters. Clark Hotaling will be the Vestry coordinator.
- 6. **Staffing**: the conclusion of the subcommittee at this point is to get monthly updates from the Rector on staffing issues.

In next month's issue, I will focus on the goals the Vestry categorized under the heading of "Growth and Vitality."

Four Emmanuel Young Adult Missioners & One Old Guy to Return to Guatemala

On May 22nd, four former members of the Senior High Youth Group and one former Senior High Leader are headed to Guatemala to serve The God's Child Project and continue work that began in June of 2005 and continued in June of 2009. The Young [Emmanuel] Adult Missioners (YAM) return to work with the extremely impoverished ...third



class citizens in a third world country. A house will be constructed and they will also work in the children's nutrition centers.

Walter Buhro spearheaded the trip. He and others of college-age talked about the 'good old days of Senior High' last July and decided to form a group of Young Emmanuelites to again come together and serve. The first mission, returning to Guatemala, was bold, but the group persevered and the trip will last 8 days, returning to Webster Groves on Sunday May 29th.

The group has been supported by the Mission's Committee, MOE and the Rector. In addition, each member has made a financial contribution towards expenses. Finally, several companies outside of the parish as well as individuals have offered financial contributions. 

You May Have Noticed Emmanuel's New Artwork (part 2)

This ceramic and glazed wall sculpture entitled *All Things Came to Be is* by Melody Evans. It symbolizes the three themes woven through the Book of Common Prayer - love, creation and the Trinity. The Trinity is represented in the three separate pieces and in the use of the primary colors. The large, curved part suggests the movement of creation. The circle, considered in the sacred geometry of ancient cultures as perfection, is also a subtle suggestion of the human heart.

Episcopal School for Ministry

The Rev. Beverly Van Horne, Interim Dean, announces that registrations continue for the 2011-2012 academic year for the Episcopal School for Ministry. The Episcopal School for Ministry of the Diocese of Missouri offers educational resources to make disciples and build congregations for the life of the world. In addition, the School exists to

- Deepen the spiritual lives and strengthen the ministries in the church and the world of all who seek to grow in the knowledge and love of God;
- Prepare people to serve the church as priests and deacons, and
- Strengthen the ministries of lay and ordained people through continuing education.

The three-year cycle of theological studies program, beginning with the Introduction to the Old Testament, is the primary training and education program for those preparing for ordination as Deacons in the Diocese of Missouri. One does not have to be a postulant or candidate for Holy Orders as a Deacon in order to register to begin the program, and acceptance to, attendance and completion of the 3 year School program of theological studies does not guarantee one will be given canonical standing as a postulant and or a candidate, or be ordained to Holy Orders.

The School holds its classes at Eden Theological Seminary in Webster Groves, MO. Those who wish to spend the night pay an additional fee for the semester to cover the room expense. In addition there are textbooks to purchase for each course. Meals for the weekend, dinner, breakfast and lunch are included in tuition. The school meets from 6:00 pm Friday to 3:00 pm the next day, Saturday. Three times a year the School meets on Saturdays to finish the term and begin the new one. On those days an all School program with a topic of general interest is held in the afternoon. Each time the members of the School gather time is spent in worship, fellowship and class.

The dates of the 2011-2012 school year are as follows: **Fall Term 2011:** Aug 20 (orientation); Sep 23-24; Oct 28-29; Dec 2-3; Dec 17 **Spring Term 2012:** Jan 27-28; Feb 24-25; Mar 23-24; Apr 21 **Summer Term 2012:** May 18-19; June 15-16; July 20-21; Aug 18

You May Have Noticed Emmanuel's New Artwork (part 3)

The *Duality of Christ* by Br. Mel depicts the dual nature of Christ, who is both human and divine. Carpenter's tools create one half and represent his human side; leaves and vines in polished steel create the other half. There is a reference to the Trinity with three over-lapping circles, and there are open spaces within the outline of the cross. The two halves of the chalice represent Christ's life-giving gifts to us. This work of art is rich in symbolism and can be a source of meditation for all who encounter it.
