## Into Holy Week — Our Walk with God

"Where is God in the midst of this?" is the question whispered at the hospital bedside of a gravely ill loved-one, or by the grandparent of a soldier fighting in a war far away or by a child in court as her family's divorce decree is "awarded" or at the grave of a teen tragically killed in a car accident. Where is God in the face of fear, sorrow and death? This is a good question for us to be asking in the face of these things, as we find our country in economic crisis and involved in multiple military conflicts or as we look upon the devastation which has occurred in Japan. This is a good question for us to be asking as we look at our fragile relationships with family, neighbor and parishioners. This is a good question for us to be asking as we look within ourselves at our spiritual journey through the last days of Lent. "Where is God now?"

Often God seems to be disturbingly absent. In the situations where God's presence, God's power, is most indispensable, God often seems impotent and neglectful. Is God fickle? Is our faith being tested? Would God really abandon us in our greatest hour of need?

From the very start of our Church Year, our worship focuses on what it means to believe in a divinity who would enter into creation and be "with us." In Advent, we sing "O come, O come, Emmanuel," that is "O come, God be with us." At Christmas, we celebrated the birth of Jesus as "God Incarnate" - which means, "God enfleshed in humanity", intimately bound to us. During Epiphany, we are reminded that the light of Jesus was borne out into the world through his earthly ministry and now continues to be embodied through us as the Body of Christ. During Lent, we reflect on what it means that Body (the community of faith) which walks with Jesus toward Jerusalem. All along, "God being with us" is the theme.

However, too often, an incredibly essential aspect of God's loving presence in Jesus is missed or avoided. In our hurry to celebrate the most important day in the Church Year, Easter, the holy days of Maundy Thursday; Good Friday; and Holy Saturday are skipped. In Holy Week, we remember that Jesus was betrayed and abandoned at "his greatest hour of need" by his followers even as they intimately broke bread together and washed each other's feet. In Holy Week, we remember that there is a Good Friday (and that it <u>is</u> "good") because Jesus showed the depth of his love by allowing himself to share the depths of our human suffering. In Holy Week, we come to remember that deep grief and great loss come into our lives because we have experienced great love. The familiar words, "No Cross, No Crown" mean that we cannot really celebrate Easter without having come together to worship during the Triduum Sacrum (the three sacred days) which conclude Holy Week. We cannot be the Resurrection Community if we have not also been the Community of the Cross.

Perhaps we do not know that God is walking with us in "our greatest hour of need" because we have not been walking with God in Jesus' most crucial hours. Perhaps we cannot imagine God could understand our pain, sorrow, fear and death because we have not yet come to witness and reflect on Jesus encountering his pain, sorrow, fear and death.

I think Holy Week is a wonderful time to walk with God.

#### Holy Week and Easter Observances

We are nearing the end of our Lenten observance. This season of penitence, self-reflection, study, and special spiritual discipline reaches its climax in Holy Week, which will begin April 17. There will be a full schedule of worship services for Holy Week. Please make every effort to attend them all. They are listed below.

#### Holy Week Observance

Palm Sunday (April 17): The worship schedule for this day will be 7:30, 9:00, and 11:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. At 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. the congregation will meet on the Jones Hall lawn to begin the service with a grand procession of the palms into the church. In the event of foul weather, we will begin in the dining hall.

Monday and Tuesday: The Holy Eucharist will be offered at 6:00 p.m.

Wednesday: The Holy Eucharist will be offered at 12:00 noon and at 6:00 p.m.

Maundy Thursday: This service begins at 7:00 p.m. and is preceded by a dinner at 6:00 p.m. As a symbol of our servanthood in Christ, we will observe his commandment to wash one another's feet. This year all members of the congregation will be invited to participate in the ritual. All who want to take part will have their feet washed and join in washing feet.

Childcare will be available starting at 6:45 p.m.

Once again this year a Garden of Gethsemane Prayer Watch will follow the Maundy Thursday service in the chapel.

#### Garden of Gethsemane Watch: Keep Awake One Hour

Jesus came and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not keep awake one hour? Keep awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." Mark 41:37-38

On the night before he was handed over to die, Jesus took his disciples to pray in the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus asked them to stay awake with him "one hour" while he faced what he knew he must do on our behalf the next day.

At Emmanuel, we endeavor to keep our Lord company in his hour of anguish by keeping watch in our own chapel (made over to resemble the garden) all night, beginning at 9:00 p.m. on Maundy Thursday, April 21, and breaking our vigil with the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday morning. For everyone's safety and comfort, we need at least two people to keep watch for each hour. Please look for the easel in the chapel and sign up to keep awake one hour.

Good Friday: Stations of the Cross conclude the Prayer Watch and begin at 7:00 a.m. in the church. The Proper Liturgy for Good Friday will be said at 12:00 noon, and the church will be left open until 3:00 p.m. for prayer and meditation.



At 7:00 p.m. we will join our friends at Christ Lutheran for Solemn Tennebrae.

Holy Saturday: The Proper Liturgy for Holy Saturday (the day our Lord lay in the tomb) at 9:00 a.m.

## News from Lui Diocese, Southern Sudan

During a recent visit Dokolo noticed that they need food, clothing, medicine, cookware. "They do not have any place to stay, they are

just under trees. We need your prayers and urgent assistance if possible."

Efforts are being made to the communicate with the other six archdeaconries of Lui diocese and Dokolo looks forward "to hearing from them by this week and hopefully next week we will take what so ever was contributed to the displaced people."

## International Anglican Bible Project aims to discover the church's role in battling climate change

Members of the worldwide Anglican Communion are working together on a project to discover what the Bible tells the church about saving the planet from environmental damage.

The Bible in the Life of the Church project manager, Stephen Lyon, said that World Environment Day was the perfect moment to reveal that the first issue under discussion would be the Environment.

"We are already seeing the impact of climate change, particularly in the developing world," he said. "Most Anglicans live in countries like India and Nigeria that will be worst hit by greater flooding, or diminishing levels of potable water.

"All faiths have a duty to protect the environment, for themselves and others. Our particular tradition, Anglicanism, has enshrined the need to protect our world in its mission statement The Five Marks of Mission\*. This is one of the reasons why we have picked this issue—to ensure that all Anglicans everywhere realize the biblical imperative to protect and sustain God's creation.


