FROM THE RECTOR

Two weeks ago, you received a letter from me about the Rev. Pamela Dolan's call to become Rector of The Church of the Good Shepherd, Town and Country, MO. By the time you receive this edition of the Angelus, we will have celebrated her ministry with us at our November 20th reception for her and we will be approaching her last Sunday at Emmanuel on November 27th. No words will adequately express all that she has meant in the life of the children and adults at Emmanuel. But I hope that each of you have taken the time to share with her how her ministry in Christ has touched your lives. This is an important time in the life of our community, and our honest expressions of thanksgiving and grief will shape Pamela and us in the future. Such expressions of sadness and gratitude will also empower her gifts in ministry as she goes to meet the people of the Church of the Good Shepherd.

As I shared with you in my letter, I will be treating the coming months as a time of transition, in preparation for hopefully welcoming another priest to join us in the ministry we share at Emmanuel. I have invited our Priest Associates, the Revs. Rod Wiltse and Warren Crews, to assist me in preaching and celebrating at our services. I have also asked the Revs. John Good and David Fly, both Priest Associates at Christ Church Cathedral in St. Louis, to share in preaching responsibilities through Easter. My hope is that the variety of voices will enliven our worship of God in the months to come.

Because I am not planning to immediately engage in a search to find Pamela's successor, I am staying in touch with all of our leaders in the ministry areas that she has been leading. I am committed to supporting them in the days ahead, so that our ministries have all the resources that they need to continue and prosper in the months ahead.

Of course, I will update you regularly about these and other staffing plans as they evolve in the days ahead. Please feel free to contact me with questions or concerns you might have.

THANKSGIVING AND ADVENT ARE COMING

Thanksgiving Day Service and Food Center Ingathering

Our annual Thanksgiving Day celebration – Holy Eucharist with Food Center Ingathering — begins at 9:00 a.m. We will be joined again this year by our brothers and sisters from Christ Lutheran Church, and their pastors, the Revs. Keith and Penny Holtse. As an outward expression of our thanksgiving for all of God's blessings, the congregation is invited to bring canned goods and cash gifts for our Food Center. During the service, we will have an opportunity to place them on the altar. Immediately after the service, volunteers are invited to stay and help bring the food to the dining room for sorting, counting and carrying to the Food Center.

Donated food should be non-perishable, such as canned vegetables, fruits, soups, stews and tuna fish. Especially welcome are peanut butter, jelly, breakfast cereal and canned pasta. Checks are also very welcome, and should be made payable to Emmanuel Church and noted "Food Center." Cash gifts maintain our food inventory long after the food collected on Thanksgiving Day is gone.

Emmanuel's Food Center is funded solely through contributions and special gifts. It is not included in Emmanuel's general operating budget. Through your generosity, the Food Center annually provides over 1,600 individuals with a three-day emergency supply of food. In addition, the Food Center funds the Operation Brown Bag Program with several Emmanuel groups preparing lunches for distribution to the homeless in St. Louis. As you see your grocery bills increase, please remember same thing is happening to the Food Center's grocery bills.

It won't be too long until Thanksgiving will be upon all of us. Last year there was a wonderful Thanksgiving at Emmanuel for all of those who don't have family near by and still want to celebrate Thanksgiving with family - your Emmanuel Family.
