St. Baldrick's: Shaving Heads, Saving Lives

Every year when Lent rolls around, people try to think of something to “give up.” One member of our parish made an unusual choice: she gave up her hair.

Actually, I'm not sure that Donna Erickson really gave up her hair for Lent; the timing might have been just a coincidence. But she did have her head shaved for charity.

If you've been around Emmanuel for a while, you probably already know Donna. She's involved in many events and committees here, perhaps most notably the Emmanuel Choir and the Adult Mission Trip. If you're new or for some other reason you don't know her, you don't know what you're missing. She's a complete delight.

Emmanuel is a parish that prides itself, and rightly so, on our commitment to mission and outreach. We have so many opportunities right here to get involved in good works, and yet I know that many of us also participate in and contribute to many good causes outside of the parish, which is wonderful. I'm sure we have Boy Scout and Girl Scout leaders, mentors, Big Brothers and Sisters, kids' coaches, and volunteers and leaders from numerous other worthy organizations in our midst every Sunday. And many of you do all that and lead ministries here at church as well. I hope that in telling you a bit about Donna's recent adventure I'm tipping my hat to all of you who do so much, both at Emmanuel and out “in the world.”

Donna has worked in the field of pediatric healthcare for over 30 years. And, as she told me, seeing too many children die of cancer over that time has raised her awareness of the need to make a financial contribution to researchers working toward a cure. So when she learned about the St. Baldrick's organization, she was ready to jump in and give even more of herself than she usually does to a good cause!

When I asked her to talk about why she did it, her answers were trenchant and thoughtful. She mentioned that recently several friends and family have faced cancer, so the issue is much on her mind and heart. She also noted that she looks for opportunities to “do something noble or simply right” that goes beyond writing a check for a good cause. More of her thoughts follow, in her own words:

I don't ‘grow’ my hair, or ‘make’ bone marrow or blood cells...those are processes God instituted and which my body does automatically. If they can symbolically, or literally, be used to the service of others than I feel an obligation to give.

It appealed to my sense of drama and bold gesture – and challenged me to examine my ideas of beauty and self. I love being older and not being so afraid of what people think of me. I also have been pleased to discover that I am NOT my hair!

Trusting that I am loved and known intimately by a God who knows the number of hairs on my head, I'm eager to see if they'll all be given back to me – and in what color!

So many people have said how brave they think I am...and I know that's not true. The truly brave ones are those children and adults who don't get a choice about losing their hair. This was a lark for me; it's life and death for them. And there's a wonderful sense of camaraderie in making a statement and standing with someone on the front lines of cancer.

Maybe Donna isn't really a hero; maybe it was a lark for her to have all her hair cut off like that. I still find it incredibly moving. One of the best things about it is that, every time I see her, I think about what she did. She becomes a symbol, a living witness, to the hopes, dreams, challenges, and needs of children living with cancer, as well as their families and caregivers. Without saying a word she reminds people that there are children whose lives are being cut short, and that there's more we can do to help.

Apparently a lot of other people have been impressed by this slightly wacky but incredibly compassionate fundraising method. According to a St. Baldrick's press release, "The Foundation funds more in childhood cancer research grants than any organization except the U.S. government." And they've recently topped \$100 million in money raised. The event that Donna participated in at Helen Fitzgerald's earlier this month raised nearly \$300,000 in one day.

So three cheers for Donna, and for all of you who give so much of yourself every day (even if you don't give up your hair!).

With Great Gratitude

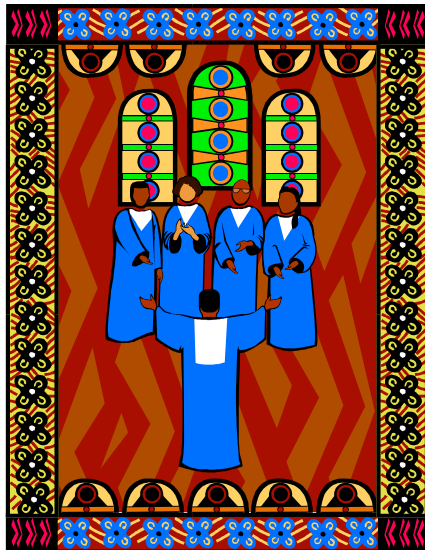

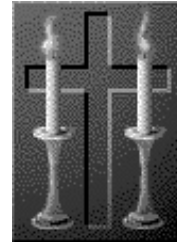

The Episcopal School for Ministry

beginning at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 16, 2011

The courses offered are as follows:

Preaching

One of the chief responsibilities of ministry is teaching the church its story and then helping the church keep that story straight. Nowhere is this more visible than in the act of preaching. Thus, satisfactory completion of **the School's courses of Old and New Testament** ~ or equivalent study of the Bible ~ **are requirements for the preaching course**. Because preaching combines a number of disciplines ~ exegesis, creative writing, oral communication ~ the focus of the course is practical. Two sermons are prepared and delivered by each student and positive feedback is given by the other students and faculty. Participation in the class by those who have not had the Old and New Testament courses as taught by the school is allowed by prior approval of the Dean and Instructor.

Christian Spirituality

Explores the intimate relationship God has established with us and the variety of responses disciples have made to God's love over the years. From the meaning of the word—*Spirituality*—the breath of life, the prayer of Israel, and the Church; from the Psalms of the Hebrew Scriptures to the Desert Mothers and Fathers, we will immerse ourselves in *The Practice of Prayer* and *Search for a Christian Spirituality* for the 21st century.

Liturgics

This course will explore several facets of liturgical leadership in a congregation. Students will gain confidence in liturgical planning, liturgical leadership and an understanding of the theology of liturgy. We will approach liturgy as a complex system of communication. We will explore how liturgy conveys its messages, what it communicates, and how to read various liturgical practices. Students will learn how to pray the liturgy for themselves, and how the liturgy shapes and forms a community's prayer life. Practically, students will learn how to put together a customary for a community, and the importance of doing so. The course will take account of the liturgical renewal movement of the twentieth century, and the new liturgical materials (*Enriching Our Worship*) approved for use in the Episcopal Church.

In addition to the above, on the Friday evenings the School is in session students will review and discuss the summer reading book, *Ethics after Easter*, by Stephen Holmgren. In the Theological Formation program all classes, worship, and meals are at Eden Seminary campus in Webster Groves, Missouri. 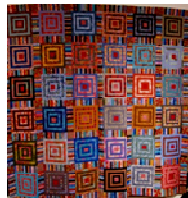

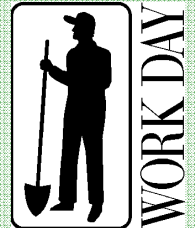
