The Permanent Stewardship Committee was formed this year with the idea that its task would be to increase the parish’s awareness of how our financial and spiritual lives interact. One of the ideas the Committee developed was to have regular articles in *The Angelus* that reflect the many, many ways in which our dollars go to work here at Emmanuel—to show, in essence, the many ways in which God’s work gets done. This month’s article is by Bob Garrecht and focuses on Webster-Rock Hill Ministries.

Webster-Rock Hill Ministries was organized in 1982 by community residents, ministers and others to serve those in need in Webster Groves and Rock Hill and build a stronger community. The Ministries provide food, utility assistance, tutoring for grade schoolers, clothing, legal help, cleaning & hygiene supplies, summer camp, home repair, etc. and referrals to other agencies.

Emmanuel was one of the founding members and our Food Pantry has served as an emergency food source on a referral basis for over 30 years. In 2012 our pantry provided food to 514 families. This was a 13% increase over 2011. Additionally, each year either the Lenten Alms, Easter or Christmas collection is dedicated for the Ministries.

Whether it’s school supplies for the Back-to-School program, items for the Giving Tree, Adopt-a Family Thanksgiving and Christmas programs or other projects, there are many opportunities for service to those in need. Your time is also valuable. This past year our Youth Group assisted at the Empty Bowls fund raiser, Christmas gift ingathering and other Ministries’ programs.

SHOEMAN WATER PROJECTS INGATHERING BEGINS FEBRUARY 13

Shoeman Water Projects is a ministry of Eagle Wings Ministries, a registered [501\(c\)\(3\)](#) non-profit [charity](#), working to alleviate as much human suffering as possible and in the process, maximize fun with a splashing good time. Shoeman Water Projects picks up donated used and new shoes year round from businesses, churches, schools, and shoe drives. Once collected, the shoes are given a second life when the Shoeman exports the donated shoes to retailers in the developing world. The resale of shoes provides jobs and affordable footwear. Funds generated from the export of shoes provides well drilling rigs, water purification systems, and hand pump repair mirco businesses bringing clean, fresh water to those who thirst.

Emmanuel will begin its shoe ingathering on February 13 to support the Shoeman Water Projects. Please bring any used shoes that are no longer being worn.

LEADING THEOLOGICALLY: CHURCH LEADERSHIP FOR OUR TIME

One-day Workshop on Saturday, February 16,
from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Emmanuel Episcopal Church

Registration due by Friday, Feb 8 (week before).

Lutheran School of Theology, Episcopal School for Ministry and the Giddings-Lovejoy Presbytery will co-sponsor a conference "Living Theologically: Leadership for our times." This conference will serve as the Annual Leadership Conference for the Diocese of Missouri. The conference is designed to help Vestries, Bishop's Committees, Sessions and Councils to think theologically about the business of the Church.

The morning sessions will focus on two "test cases" most congregations deal with—the stewardship drive and youth ministry. Three panelists, one from each denomination, will discuss the case studies from the perspective of the theological resources of each tradition, and how those resources might be brought to bear in the life of a congregation. The conference will also provide opportunity for sharing of ideas and resources among participants.

After lunch, each denomination will have its own break-out session. For Episcopalians, Episcopal School for Ministry and Bishop Smith will lead a conversation about structuring the life of the diocese and of congregations around the five marks of mission being used by The Episcopal Church to name its priorities. We will also have an opportunity to discuss the upcoming restructuring of the national church around those priorities and how congregations might do the same.

Panelists are: the Rev. Dr. Daniel Anderson-Little, most recently pastor of Trinity Presbyterian Church in University City for 14 years; the Rev. Dr. Daniel Handschy, rector of Advent Episcopal Church in Crestwood and Dean of the Episcopal School for Ministry; and the Rev. Karen Scherer, pastor of Unity Lutheran Church in Bel-Nor.

GIVING OPPORTUNITIES

Did you know that earlier this month Congress passed legislation extending the IRA charitable rollover? The law includes many ways for you to use your IRA to make gifts to charity this year.

There are three primary ways you can use your IRA to support your Episcopal faith community in 2013

- **Continuation:** The new law continues the IRA rollover for 2012 and 2013. If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can make a gift to Emmanuel from your IRA in 2013.
- **Catch-Up:** The new law has a provision that allows you to make catch-up gifts for 2012 from your IRA to Emmanuel if made during **January 2013**.
- **Conversion:** The new law also allows you to convert a taxable 2012 required minimum distribution (RMD) from your IRA to a non-taxable distribution if you transfer those funds to a charity in **January 2013**.

The deadline to take advantage of some of these opportunities in January 31, 2013.
