Martie's Minute : A LENTEN FAST

I've noticed that not a lot of fasting goes on at dinnertime around Emmanuel. I have savored some incredible meals here since Ash Wednesday. But there are other kinds of fasts. I have recently been involuntarily participating in one.

A month after arriving, my office walls are still bare, a kind of fast for the spirit. I know what I would like to see there: something that would remind me of God's goodness, of the beauty of creation and of the life we share.

After considering acquiring something new, I decided instead to hang a painting from my own collection. So with the excitement of a child before Christmas, I went to our "3-Season-Converted-Into-Storage" room to search among the pile of brown cardboard crates marked, "Pics." Immediately, I realized this was going to be harder than I had imagined. I began opening crates of what I guessed to be the approximate size and shape of the painting I sought but found, instead, any number of interesting pieces once loved but nothing up to this special spot where I would meet parishioners and write sermons.

As the debris of cardboard crates and shriveled tape mounted, a feeling of chagrin crept over me. I have always had a certain guilt, and at times in my life, scorn, for thoughtless acquisition. Usually my critique was like that of Judas, that the money be better spent on the poor – you know, feeding the hungry, housing the homeless. All good things. But looking at my pile of stuff, I realized it was too much, not just from a moral standpoint, but from a life stand point. My excess stuff was hindering me from finding something that was really meaningful – my wonderful, humorous, truthful painting for my office.

No wonder it's as hard for a rich woman to get into heaven as for a camel to go through the eye of a needle. I was too encumbered to go anywhere!

I've noticed that I have lived perfectly happily without the things in most of those boxes. A fast from some of my stuff has helped me see how little I need it. I will be happy when I find my painting. But my Lenten fast has convinced me that my next Lenten discipline is a big garage sale.

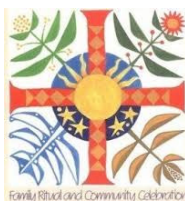
FAITHQUEST and GODLY PLAY YOUTH PROGRAM and ADULT FORUM

The Vestry met for our annual retreat the weekend of February 22-23. We welcomed Mark DeYoung, Suzie Florent, John Liss and Ann Marie Ruhlin. And we were joined by our new priest associates, Sarah and Martie as well. Friday night was spent getting to know one another then we launched into discussing “where we are and how we got here”. That exercise continued on Saturday morning as we began to identify the core values or the essence of what makes this place Emmanuel. We had great discussions but were not able to finish distilling the conversations in the time we had. I can report that we had consensus about the importance of worship & spiritual formation; outreach & community; hospitality and what one sub group called “dynamic continuity of these values”. We will continue to discuss how to integrate these values into our common life together at the March Vestry meeting.

There was a Metro III meeting that Saturday so we were not joined by any delegates or alternate delegates. But they will join us at future Vestry meetings.

We did not review financials this month as is our practice in February. We will do that in more detail at the March meeting. Lent is in full swing now and clergy are busy with Lenten Study programs, services and preparing. Most vestry members are participating in the Lenten program on Same Gender Blessings. And Dan will be reporting more on that topic as we move past Lent.

We will continue the practice of informing you of the work of the vestry in the Angelus either in the form of details of meetings or in the form of a reflection that is important to our work. And as always, should anyone have any questions or concerns for anyone on vestry, please feel free to email or call Dan or any of us. I believe I can say with certainty that everyone who serves on vestry accepts the responsibility that we represent the entire parish and hope you feel listened to, and part of this parish family at all times!

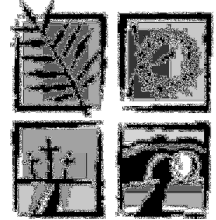
HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE

We are nearing the end of our Lenten observance. This season of penitence, self-reflection, study, and special spiritual discipline reaches its climax in Holy Week, which will begin March 25. There will be a full schedule of worship services for Holy Week. Please make every effort to attend as many as possible. They are listed below.

Palm Sunday: Worship at 8:00 am, 9:00 am, 10:30 am and 5:30 pm

Monday and Tuesday: The Holy Eucharist will be offered at 6:00 p.m.

Wednesday: The Holy Eucharist will be offered at 12:00 noon and at 6:00 p.m.



Maundy Thursday: This service begins at 7:00 p.m. and is preceded by a dinner at 6:00 p.m. As a symbol of our servanthood in Christ, we will observe his commandment to wash one another's feet. This year all members of the congregation will be invited to participate in the ritual. All who want to take part will have their feet washed and join in washing feet. Childcare will be available starting at 6:00 p.m.

Once again this year a Garden of Gethsemane Prayer Watch will follow the Maundy Thursday service in the chapel.

Garden of Gethsemane Watch: Keep Awake One Hour

Jesus came and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not keep awake one hour? Keep awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." Mark 41:37-38

On the night before he was handed over to die, Jesus took his disciples to pray in the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus asked them to stay awake with him "one hour" while he faced what he knew he must do on our behalf the next day.

At Emmanuel, we endeavor to keep our Lord company in his hour of anguish by keeping watch in our own chapel (made over to resemble the garden) all night, beginning at 9:00 p.m. on Maundy Thursday, March 28, and breaking our vigil on Good Friday morning. For everyone's safety and comfort, we need at least two people to keep watch for each hour. Please look for the easel in the chapel and sign up to keep awake one hour.

Good Friday: The Prayer Watch concludes at 7:00 a.m. in the church. The church will be left open from 7:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. for prayer and meditation.

Stations of the Cross Pilgrimage, 1:00 pm to 4:30 pm

Use the Stations of the Cross meditations on pilgrimage as a wayfarer – in search of sacred places and thoughts. The act of travel itself is an act of devotion, requiring dedication and attention. Each destination has meaning which helps one to greater understanding. The words and the sites can help one grasp the meaning of events we hold onto from two thousand years ago. One must sign up for a seat on the bus.

The Proper Liturgy for Good Friday will be said at 12:00 noon.

Solemn Tenebrae Service: At 7:00 p.m. we will join our friends at Christ Lutheran for Solemn Tenebrae.

Holy Saturday: The Proper Liturgy for Holy Saturday (the day our Lord lay in the tomb) at 9:00 a.m.

The celebration of our Lord's resurrection begins Saturday at sunset with **The Great Vigil of Easter.** The Vigil begins at 7:30 p.m. and includes Holy Baptism.

Easter Sunday: Our celebration of Christ's victory over sin and death continues on Sunday with services at 8:00, 9:00, and 10:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.

This is a glorious time of year for the Church. Easter gives us our primary identity as people of the Resurrection, and Holy Week prepares us to celebrate God's gift to us with deep and abiding joy.

Make sure to be here. Bring a friend! There is no greater celebration.

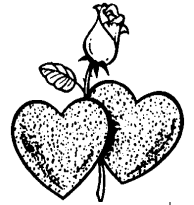

Senior High to Volunteer at Harvey Kornblum and Laclede Groves

The senior High Youth Group has scheduled a trip to Laclede Groves next month to interact with residents there. “We hope to make the youth more aware of the needs of older people,” said JoAn MacBryde, one of the leaders planning the trip. “One of the great things about Emmanuel is the generational interaction, and this is an opportunity to expand that aspect of our lives.”

The youth will be working primarily with residents who do not have many opportunities to get away from their residence. “It will be good for them to have a chance to see new faces,” said JoAn. Although there are no Emmanuel parishioners in the wing where the youth will visit, there are a number of Emmanuelites who are

residents of the Laclede complex, and they are invited to participate in the event, which is a new addition to the group’s calendar.

Meanwhile, as we approach Holy Week, the emphasis for youth has been on preparations for the summer mission trip to Guatemala with lessons about the country and culture which the group will visit. There will be as many as 40 leaders and youth on the trip, financed in large part by huge support from the parish. The group will also return to volunteer at the Harvey Kornblum Jewish Food Pantry on April 7, where they will sort and shelve incoming donations and prep bags of groceries for distribution to the community.

Miss Carol's Breakfast Ministry – The "Egg Team"



For ten years Christ Church Cathedral has hosted the **Miss Carol's breakfast program**. The program serves homeless in the downtown community every Saturday morning, in honor of our late beloved parishioner, Carol Bledsoe.

Kelsey Mitchell has raised funds at Emmanuel to support the breakfast ministry and to honor Carol's life and her ministry to the homeless.

Emmanuel Church has the opportunity, this May through September, (on the **3rd Saturday** of the month), to help prepare Breakfast bags, filled with three hard boiled eggs and a banana, supplying a wonderful source of greatly needed protein. It takes 36 dozen hard boiled eggs each week to fill the bags. We need 12 volunteers each month to purchase and prepare 3 dozen hard boiled eggs. The eggs would need to be delivered to Emmanuel on the 2nd Sunday of the month and I will deliver them to the Cathedral volunteer. I will gather the names of everyone willing to join the "egg team" and keep this organized each month.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The men's breakfast and Bible study actually began in June, 2005, after the first Guatemala Mission Trip. Clark Hotaling and Marc Braun discussed the impact of that trip, how the Concentric Circles of "good" were flowing from what had been experienced on the trip, and how the good from these experiences could be continued in the immediate community of Emmanuel. Marc and Clark met a few more times, and Marc really wanted to tie future meetings to Biblical Study. Davis Allen was added to the group, which had been having breakfasts at the recently opened Stratton's, and they decided that it would be a good place for breakfast and Bible Study. **The management of Stratton's was very supportive, and we have been meeting there continuously ever since.**

We began with a formalized book format, but soon preferred the informal study of the lectionary (*the Old Testament, Psalms, Epistles, and Gospel* readings) of the following Sunday. The latent Biblical knowledge of the participants was surprising, but under the tutelage and input of, first, Rev. Rod Wiltse, and currently Rev Warren Crews, we have deeply expanded our knowledge, understanding, and yes, the mystery of the Word.

Another dimension that has been added to our group is the participation of Eden Seminarians from Africa. Two have become bishops of the church: the Rev. Stephen Dokolo from Lui and the Rev Isaiah Chambala from Tanzania. Agrippa Ndatila and Frederick Chingwaba are our current seminarians from Tanzania. To hear them read Biblical passages or the prayers in their native tongue is to encounter the work of the Holy Spirit on a first hand and personal basis.

Our current group consists of Davis Allen, Jerre Birdsong, Bill Cochran, the Rev. Warren Crews, Frederick Chingwaba, Jim Groetsch, Tom Jones, and Andy Rikand. We realize that work schedules and personal commitments keep us from always attending. Perfect attendance is not a requirement. And we want to mention that a great breakfast and a lively discussion of current news and sports usually always precede the Bible Study.
