Dear Friends,

Periodically, people ask me what I am doing in the “councils” of the Episcopal Church, now that I have stepped down from both *The Standing Committee for Ecumenical and Interreligious Relations* and *The Advisory Committee for the Anglican Observer at the United Nations*. As I mentioned in my Annual Report, I have been appointed to a six-year term on *The Standing Committee on World Mission (SCWM)*. I asked for this assignment in large part because of Emmanuel's commitment to being "Bold in Mission." I have attended its first meeting and have been a part of teleconferences in the intervening months. In late February, I was invited by its chair, Sandra McPhee to join her at the Global Episcopal Mission Network’s (GEMN) Annual Conference, being held May 5-10 in Bogotá, Columbia. Participants will be engaging in global mission workshops and presentations, networking with others working in mission around the world and sharing in a closing Eucharist lead by Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts-Schori. There will also be formation programs for mission agents and daily opportunities to visit working mission sites in the region. So I am about to discover what others in the Episcopal Church are doing in mission.

Some background for you about both of these groups might be helpful. The Church’s Mandate for the Standing Commission on World Mission is to: have direct engagement with and experience in world mission; review and evaluate policies, priorities, and strategies for global mission; and to make recommendations regarding global mission to General Convention. The SCWM is to be rooted in prayer and guided by the principles of Mutual Responsibility and Interdependence (MRI). It is also to give priority to the following areas:

- Networking
- Covenant/Bilateral Committees
- Companion Diocese Network
- Mission Sending



The conference I am attending is being organized by GEMN, which is an organization that is open to all individuals, organizations and dioceses with a heart for mission. GEMN is dedicated to the principle that every Episcopalian is a missionary. They are committed to connecting dioceses, congregations and individuals who are engaged in global mission to:

- Facilitate and strengthen mission programs, relationships, and ministries throughout the world;
- Provide a training curriculum for Global Mission Agents who will support global mission efforts in their diocese, organization or church;
- Sponsor an annual mission conference (Institute) for education, training and exchange of global mission ideas and initiatives;
- Foster and support mutually responsible and interdependent relationships and accountability among mission-minded individuals, organizations and dioceses within the Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion.

I am glad to be going to Bogota in the days leading up to the times when our various mission trips begin. I feel blessed to be given the opportunity to learn about the place of mission in the Episcopal Church and am hopeful that it might enrich Emmanuel's attempts to be "Bold in Mission!" For I truly believe that it is through the mission of the Church we are invited to act as God's feet and hands in our world today - to be a source for healing; seeking justice; making peace; going out in compassion; and welcoming those we encounter with hospitality. Through mission, we are formed as a community when we hear the Great Commandment to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength; and to love our neighbors. For me this is a central sign of the vitality of our faith and that which leads the people of Emmanuel, from the youngest to the oldest, to venture forth into the world in the name of Jesus.

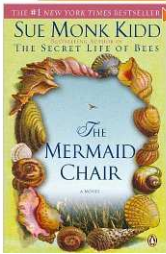

experience for our youth and, we hope, a great service to the residents.”

The youth also have the spring car wash scheduled for May 5. “There are quite a few cars in the parish that look as if they could stand some attention,” said leader Ian MacBryde.

Meanwhile, last minute planning continues for the mission trip to Guatemala in June, which has been heavily financed by donations from the parish and elsewhere. “We have 38 youth and leaders going,” said Kevin Williams. “It’s wonderful.”

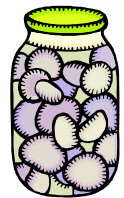
