Martie's Message - WOE is Me

Early this spring, the newly reorganized Women of Emmanuel (WOE) hosted a reception for Sarah and me to get better acquainted. The food was great, the libations sufficient to quench our Friday after work thirst, and the company terrific. Sarah and I kidded around a bit passing the hot potato of "tell us about your life", after a nice glass of wine, and we all laughed a lot. I went home feeling very happy to be a part of Emmanuel Church, and of WOE. "Woe," I thought, "WOE is me!" Of course, I know that is not grammatically correct, but I hope you will take the point; I was feeling very glad to be a part of it. In fact, I resolved to write an Angelus article by the same title.

When I actually sat down to write said article, a few days ago, WOE is me, had taken on a new angle; Woe is me, Sarah is moving! Now as a priest and pastor, I am delighted for Sarah that she is moving into the job for which she has worked and trained for years. Bravo, and congrats! It is for myself that I am feeling the loss of her great spirit and collegiality, as I suspect many of you are, too.

The truth is, priests come and go, and the parish remains, steadfastly answering God's call. And Emmanuel, I must say here, answers that call brilliantly.

So, even without Sarah's wonderful presence, I am still delighted to say WOE is me!

Now, I just want to take a minute to tell you a little about what I somewhat glibly refer to as the "reorganization" of the women's group. Mimi and Mart have taken on a coordinating role, because someone had to, but the organization is minimal. The three of us sat down and tried to think what we would like to do in the upcoming program year, and who could be relied upon for making those things happen. Some of our criteria were:

I'm really most excited about our fall showing of "Girls Rising," a documentary about nine extraordinary girls struggling for education in nine of the poorest, most oppressive cultures in the world. I learned about this film from my 20

something daughter and her friends in San Diego who insisted the "you have to see this!" and that I should figure out how to schedule a showing if one wasn't already scheduled nearby. The writing, narration, directing are all academy level and I was riveted. I was delighted that some of our Emmanuel women felt the same way after watching the trailer. What a joy to have church friends, "sisters", as we old wave feminists might say, to do these things with!

Which puts me back where I started: WOE is me! And am I ever glad!

Emmanuel Emergency Food Center

There are concerns about the financial situation of the Emmanuel Food Center and I want you to know some of the details of how the situation evolved.

We had **100 more clients** the first four months of 2013 than we had during the same time period in 2012 and everyone who buys groceries knows that food prices have gone up.

• In 2012 the Food Center had a balances as follows:

January 1, 2012 \$8487. June 1, 2012 \$6629.

• In 2013 the Food Center had balances as follows:

January 1, 2013 \$5907. February 1, 2013 \$5608. March 1, 2013 \$4765. April 1, 2013 \$4460.

• We ordered our milk supply in May which cost \$1871.

The volunteers who grocery shop for the Food Center

will be shopping at Aldi's next week and buying what is needed to provide a nutritious three day food supply.

• In April our grocery bill was \$787.

The Emmanuel Food Center is in desperate need of additional funding to assist the many families who have come to depend on us through the Webster Rock Hill Ministries. **Please give generously.**

CPR/ AED Training at Emmanuel

Dear Emmanuel family members,

Often, when I ask about CPR or Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) training, people tend to back away and look for an escape route. Many responses have to do with just plain fear, the "ick factor" of breathing for a stranger, or the panic that they might push a button and really hurt someone. Most common fears about CPR are no longer an issue and the AED machine is automatic and tells <u>you</u> what to do.

Would any of us not go to the aid of the person near us if they needed help? God sometimes has a way of asking us to do something even when we want Him to ask the other guy! Trained people save lives. It is that simple. A family will have more years with Mom or Dad, Brother or Sister, etc. because someone knew what to do.

A special opportunity is coming to Emmanuel that I hope you and members of your committee will take part in. On Saturday, June 29, 2013, we will have a training session on CPR and the use of an (AED) in


SHARP until participants complete their certification at or before 1 PM. The cost is \$20.00 per person and there is scholarship money available. We have 30 slots for training that day. You need only to be as smart as a 5th grader, the instruction level of an AED machine, and be able to get on a floor. (Notice that there is no requirement to get up from the floor!)

Stewardship Committee—Outreach Community Garden

The Stewardship Committee was formed in 2012 with the idea that its task would be to increase the parish's awareness of how our financial and spiritual lives interact. One of the ideas the Committee developed was to have regular articles in *The Angelus* that reflect the many, many ways in which our dollars go to work here at Emmanuel—to show, in essence, the many ways in which God's work gets done. This month's article is by Tracy Crews and focuses on the Outreach Community Garden.

The Outreach Community Garden of Emmanuel, located on the property of Webster-Rock Hill Ministries, started in 2010 as an effort to supply Emmanuel's Food Pantry with fresh vegetables for patrons. The Garden consists of 3 raised beds that are six by twelve feet long.

The first summer having the garden provided a bounty of veggies, but the last two summers, the heat and drought took its toll and the harvest was sparse. This spring we have been off to a great start with the help of Girl Scout Troop 4495 jumping in to help! Troop 4495 will be earning their Silver Award for their efforts!

To date, we have planted green beans, carrots, tomatoes (lovingly donated by the Environmental Stewardship Committee), okra and watermelon. This has been the first summer that I have had so many extra hands and it truly makes a difference how much more can be accomplished!

If you are interested in getting your hands dirty and learning about what it takes to raise a garden but don't know where to start, this is a great opportunity to learn! And the best reward is seeing the faces of the Patrons at the Food Center when they walk out with fresh produce that was picked that morning!



On Thursday, June 13, at 6:00 PM, the Church of St. Michael & St. George will host a festival evensong for the feast of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. Worshippers will enjoy glorious music and medieval pageantry and

be invited to join in prayers for peace in the Holy Land and the welfare of the poor and sick. Both the Bishop of Missouri and the Dean of Christ Church Cathedral will participate.

This annual festival evensong and service of rededication is celebrated by the Order of St. John, which is both an active, practical charity and an order of chivalry headed by Queen Elizabeth II. This year's service will include the world premiere of a two-part anthem composed

by Rob Lehman, the organist and choirmaster at the Church of St. Michael and St. George, and based on a poem by Friedrich Schiller. The guest preacher will be the Rev. 



In-Gathering of School Supplies for WRHM


July 7 - 28 we will hold our annual in-gathering of school supplies for the children of families served by the Webster Rock Hill Ministries.

2013 Lui Mission Trip by Cynthia Rapp

Three members of Emmanuel have been selected to return to Lui, South Sudan as part of the mission team from the Diocese of Missouri in August/September 2013. **Rick Kuhn**, who has traveled there twice previously, and **Carl and Cynthia Rapp**, members of last year's team, have been called and chosen to join the mission team which will join up with teams from England and Sweden in South Sudan.

Bishop Stephen Dokolo of Lui and our own **Bishop Wayne Smith** have coordinated plans for specific projects that will benefit the Moru people of Lui and deepen our relationship with them. The foremat of the mission trip is different this time with the team divided into 2 groups spending two weeks each in Lui with an overlap of 4 days in the middle to collaborate and pass on the projects. The first team will leave in two months on August 11 and return August 27, and the second team will leave on August 20 and return September 6.

Carl and Cynthia will be traveling on the first team. Carl along with Tim Baker, Trinity Episcopal Church Kirksville, will be constructing the roof to complete the chapel at the Episcopal Luinjini School. The members of the Carpentry Class from 2012 will be continuing their training through this project to learn valuable skills. Rick will be going on the second team. The goal is to have a beautiful chapel where the 800 students can finally worship.

Under the leadership of team leader Evelyn Smith, chair of the Companion Diocese Committee, **Cynthia** will be teaching English to members of the Mothers' Union and young adults using song and rhythmic chant. Krista Baker, Kirksville; Martha Colville, Holy Cross Popular Bluff; and Annette Joseph, Rector of Holy Cross, are also members of the first team. The additional members of the second team will include Dan Smith, Canon to the Ordinary, and Debbie Smith, who has handled the Sudan travel logistics for several years and is a teacher of English as a Second Language.

The rich heritage of the partnership in Christ between the people of Lui, our diocese, and Emmanuel has been rewarding and a true blessing. Your generosity has helped build wells, send other missioners, welcome visitors from Lui, and sustain the partnership.


