Rich in Love



This being my first Stewardship season at Emmanuel, I was curious to see what would happen. Every parish approaches this topic differently, and I wondered what would happen here.

Soon after I joined the staff, I recall hearing that our theme for the year would be “Rich in Love” and that the congregation would write and receive letters around that theme. Right, I thought. We are going to get people to write letters? I have been in parishes where nobody under 60 will even open a letter, much less write one! Maybe we should send tweets, instead?

What I forgot is that everybody loves to get a love letter! And that's what is happening. We are writing and opening love letters!

Emmanuel expresses its love in a myriad of ways, too many to list here, but including reaching out to Webster-Rockhill Ministry, St. Louis, the Indian nation, and far corners of the world, with resources of food, labor and skill. It seems that nobody is too young or too old to go on a mission trip. We also reach out in love to one another. Last summer in one 10 day period, the Verger, Lay Eucharistic Ministers, and Funeral Committee helped 3 families bury their loved ones and greet family afterwards. Many of the same people have been on hand since to help celebrate important joyful milestones in our lives as well. We care for the young and for the old. (This is not to say that we can't use more help, especially in our Sunday ministries with children, so don't be shy if you feel drawn to these ministries!)

I have seen just how rich in love Emmanuel is not because I walk among folks who blissfully and serenely smile at me day to day, but because I work among people who put their love into action.

Some people would call that loving one another as Christ loves us. Some would call it discipleship. It also could be called Stewardship, meaning, faithfully using the resources God has entrusted to us for God's purposes, that is, caring for God's people and God's world.

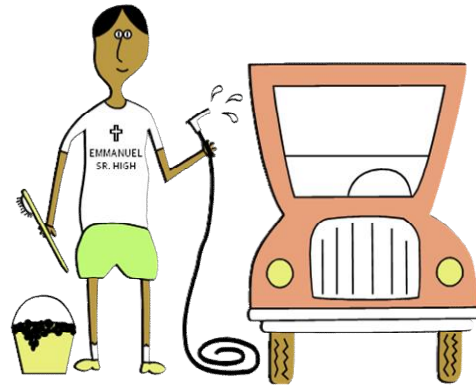

Contemplation is word used to cover the whole of prayer. It is necessary in reading...as in the prayers of the Church, our story found in the Bible and in our family history as the People of God.

St. Paul tells us as the Church to aim at doing and being what is best for each other and for everyone. Always be joyful; pray without ceasing; give thanks for everything; this is what God longs for from us who are alive in Christ Jesus.

Lauren has been a Peace Corps volunteer in Kenya, a missionary in Haiti (after the earthquake which devastated the country), a missionary in the Diocese of Renk (Sudan) teaching in a theological college, as well as a journalist. She earned a Doctorate of Ministry from Virginia Theological Seminary and is fluent in over 15 languages.

She is a dynamic speaker and her passion for Mission shines through her words, her actions and is vividly reflected in her life choices.

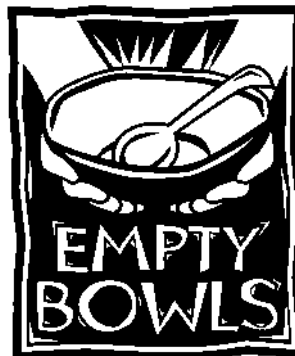

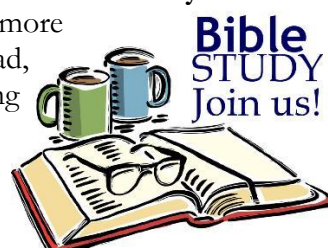
Stewardship - Tuesday Morning Bible Study

The Stewardship Committee was formed in 2012 with the idea that its task would be to increase the parish's awareness of how our financial and spiritual lives interact. Emmanuel's **Tuesday Morning Bible Study** provides another opportunity for spiritual growth as our community becomes "Rich in Love." Our Stewardship Committee has emphasized the importance of the power of words. What can be more powerful than the "Words of God"? We hear, read, and meditate upon God's words in scripture during our study sessions.

Trinity Institute: Save the Date!

Trinity Institute's 43rd National Theological Conference: *The Good News Now: Evolving with the Gospel of Jesus*, will be held **November 22 – 23, 2013 at Emmanuel Episcopal Church.**

The story of Jesus has spoken powerfully to generations for more than two millennia, but how has it continued to be made relevant over thousands of years? In late November, a diverse group of leading scholars and theologians will take up the challenge of articulating the story of Jesus anew. At Trinity Institute's 43rd National Theological Conference, *The Good News Now: Evolving with the Gospel of Jesus*, they will consider how historic tenets of the faith address current realities and relate fresh and meaningful ways to recount the story for these times.

City Streets up-date for 2013-2014

What is City Streets? It is Emmanuel volunteers working with Americorps to provide emergency shelter and food for the homeless when the weather gets into the low 20's. We provide food for three breakfasts and three dinners on specific weekends when it gets that cold. The dinners are prepared at Emmanuel after church and are taken to Americorps in Soulard. The breakfast items are purchased in bulk and stored at Americorps for use as needed.

This year we have seven dates, beginning with November 10, to prepare dinners and have 34 volunteers for the seven dates. There is also a group that prepare desserts to accompany the dinners. In the past we have collected winter clothing and blankets, and expect that we will be doing it again this year. While we will probably have enough in our budget to meet this year's costs, we are right on the edge with our finances, and donations will be gratefully accepted.

Thanks to everyone at Emmanuel for their continued support. This is yet another example of how Emmanuel is, indeed, rich in love and in service to others.

Five years and over \$3 million later, the debt to complete this project has been whittled down to just \$86,000! The pledges are still rolling in but we expect a shortfall of about \$60,000 needed to pay back the loan from the Diocese.

Much of our conversation at the October Vestry meeting was devoted to various options on how this will be accomplished. For those of you who have joined us at Emmanuel in the last few years, this is how far we've come: an amazing \$2.5 million in pledges combined with an \$800,000 loan from the diocese equals spacious classrooms, meeting rooms and an elevator, all so beautifully crafted that from the outside, one could imagine these were all part of the original building.

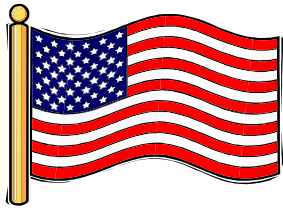
We've come a long way, Baby!

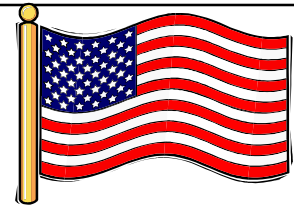

- Grade School aged children (2nd grade – 6th grade) – Join the Junior Choir rehearsals on Wednesdays, December 4 and 11, 6:30 – 7:15 pm, and attend the Saturday morning rehearsal.
- “Cherub”, (age 4 – 1st grade) – Join the Cherub Choir rehearsals on Wednesdays, December 4 and 11, 6:00-6:25 pm and attend the Saturday morning rehearsal **from 11:15 am – Noon only**.

Junior Choir and Cherub Choir aged children who can’t attend on Wednesdays are welcome to be in the play, but are not likely to learn enough of the music on Saturday morning to fully participate. They are welcome to be there on Sunday morning, stand with the chorus and participate as they are able.

In it he wrote: "Anyway, as I watch the Cardinals, I am reminded of a wedding I performed at All Star break in 7/65, when the Rector (Pitt Willand) was on vacation. A young gal (regular worshipper) had asked if I could officiate at her wedding during All Star break, for her husband was a rookie on Cardinals. I said, "Sure" - however, we needed to have some pre-marriage sessions. She came in with this big, quiet guy - he never said a word during our meetings & sweated a lot :). He had played in Canada for a team her father managed (she was a Canadian Anglican). I held the ceremony (should be in the books) & there were a few people there & some TV afterward. That Sept I went off to South Africa on a one-year exchange... the "Rookie" was Steve Carlton !! Wife named Beverley.

After receiving the email, **Dan, Kevin Williams and Susie Feldmann** dug out (pun intended) the old books and found the Marriage entry for Steve Norman Carlton and Beverley Anne Brooks on July 12, 1965.
