### Thankful for Light in the Darkness



Last Tuesday at 7:15 AM (yes, those of you who know me will be sure I mean 7PM, but really, it was morning!), Paul and I were out on our recently routine rounds, picking out and picking up various building supplies for our house renovation. This time we were at Henry Plumbing

Company on Kingshighway. I had already purchased one faucet, but it looked too small, and I had spent the night obsessing about whether it would work. Now this is what my daughter would call a truly bourgeois anxiety, meaning neurotically superficial and therefore in conflict with the values I taught her. Yet, my embarrassment was less pressing than my determination to get the right faucet for my kitchen, so there we were, soliciting the assistance of the Henry staff before AM coffee.

My qualms were confirmed. I had bought a "prep faucet", not meant for my closeout-bargain, giant sink. So, I began again, searching around for the next best "bargain" until Gail Smith, Sales Manager led me through the maze, directly to a suitable faucet which was IN STOCK! If you have ever remodeled, you will appreciate that.

Now, Gail and I have developed a relationship over the couple months that I have been running in to pick up this or that item – a shower base here, a pedestal sink there. I know that she just went through a remodeling and move of her own, and she knows that I work at Emmanuel Church. So, it was just natural, I suppose that she stopped to ask me if I knew of any Food Pantry that could use food.

It turns out that Gail, her daughter, and some of the other sales people at Henry collect tiles left over from various jobs, make them into jewelry, and then take them to craft fairs to be given away in exchange for freewill offerings. They have used the resources to expand a Henry Plumbing tradition of giving back to the community. That day, they had \$3,000 in jewelry proceeds which they were taking to Aldis, to fill their pickup truck. Gail had located two Food Pantries that could accept food that day, but needed one more. To make a long story a bit shorter, I will say that later that day, the good elves from Henry Plumbing supply delivered

over 350 items of food requested by Ann Bain. Who would expect to come upon manna from heaven among plumbing supplies?

Later this week, I understand that we will have a parade of pupils from The College School delivering wagon loads of food to be distributed through our pantry. Little children, teachers, and parents, all have told me about this annual phenomena of generosity from our community, to our community, funneled through our pantry.

Thanksgiving, itself, is a legendary outpouring of mounds of food brought up to the altar by worshipers from Emmanuel and Christ Church Lutheran at the 9AM Thursday Eucharist.

And then, once in a while, an unidentified "neighbor" of Emmanuel will drop by with a cache of edibles, just because they appreciate the need we serve here. All of this is made possible by the Emmanuel volunteers who plan, shop, stock, and staff the pantry 5 days a week, 12 months a year, year after year! The dedication is truly inspirational. And of course, this is the only the oldest and biggest of many ministries of Emmanuel that feed people in need.

The sad, dark, truth is, all this food will be gone- given to people who are hungry- before you know it. We have more hungry people than the richest nation in the world should have. But the good thing is that everywhere we turn, people are reaching out to others in generosity.

Isaiah says, "If you offer your food to the hungry, and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness, and your gloom will be as noonday." (Is 58.10)



### Women's Book Club Monday, December 2 at 7:00 p.m.

Sarah's Key by Tatiana de Rosnay; here's a mini-review adapted from Amazon.com:

Paris, July 1942: Sarah, a ten year-old Jewish girl is brutally arrested with her family by the French police in the Vel' d'Hiv' roundup, but not before she locks her younger brother in a cupboard in the family's apartment, thinking that she will be back within a few hours.

Paris, May 2002: On Vel' d'Hiv's 60th anniversary, journalist Julia Jarmond is asked to write an article about this black day in France's past. Through her contemporary investigation, she stumbles onto a trail of long-hidden family secrets that connect her to Sarah. Julia finds herself compelled to retrace the girl's ordeal, from that terrible day, to the camps, and beyond. As she probes into Sarah's past, she begins to question her own place in France, and to reevaluate her marriage and her life.

Tatiana de Rosnay offers us a brilliantly subtle,

compelling portrait of France under occupation, revealing the taboos and silence that surround this painful episode.

### The Egg Team and Miss Carol's Breakfast Ministry

Every Saturday morning at Christ Church Cathedral there is an early morning breakfast served to homeless children, women and men. The main breakfast consists of hard boiled eggs and bananas, vital sources of protein.



Many of the parishes in the Diocese participate in providing <u>36 dozen</u> hard boiled eggs each week. This past year a few of us from Emmanuel started going once a month to Miss Carol's to help prepare and serve the breakfast.

My desire to do more to help this ministry named in honor of our own Carol Bledsoe was always present. An opportunity presented itself last spring when St. Timothy's asked if Emmanuel could take over their egg ministry while their kitchen was being renovated. The eggs they donate are prepared by their youth in their kitchen. Emmanuel folks quickly responded to the call and we became the "Egg Team".

Over the last seven months, the Emmanuel "Egg Team" has prepared over 3,000 eggs for Miss Carol's. Over a year's time, 22,464 eggs are served at Miss Carol's. Going forward, Emmanuel will share the ministry with St. Timothy's providing eggs once a month.

Please know your prayers and support of this ministry for the homeless in our midst is greatly needed and appreciated.


