The success of the journey to the manger was such cause for celebration that we all feasted on “Kings Cakes” which hid little trinkets for 3 lucky wise persons to find beneath the frosting.

Such a simple little celebration, yet, so full of joy as we recalled the wondrous event of the Christ child, year after year. The humble humanity, the hidden spot, the strange and marvelous collection of worshippers, all came to life for us.

Jesus came in the most humble way, to the most humble place, to the most unexpected witnesses, totally vulnerable. How did the Wisemen believe that that was where God would be found? Can we believe it today? **Can we look in those humble, dark, vulnerable places to see the face of Christ born again for us?**

Youth Sunday - February 2

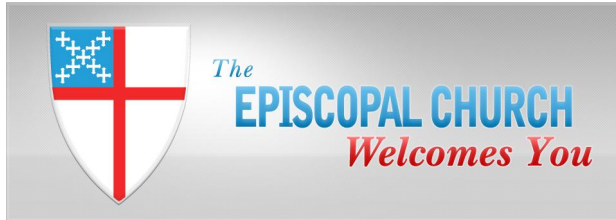

The group's leadership is also working to fill in the group's spring schedule, planning for some service projects in the community.



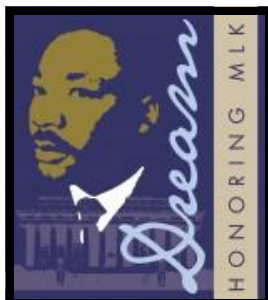
Christmas Play Thanks

Dave says that he is humbled by the opportunity of serving on the vestry of such a loving and inclusive church.

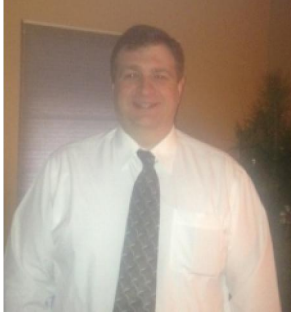

You need not have set a baptismal date to come to one of these sessions.

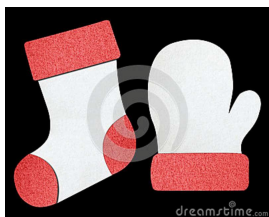
