## Science and Religion: Conflict or Concord - Jan. 12, 19, Feb. 2 Matt Schunke & Matthew Keefer

We are living in exciting times! There is now an abundance of new research in the human and life sciences that is providing exciting new insights into our human nature. Areas that were previously on the periphery of investigation are now in the forefront, e.g., morality, free will, and yes, even religion. While these findings are exciting they do prove a challenge to accommodate within our commonsense or traditional understandings. Join us over a three-week Adult Forum series where we will introduce you to some of these exciting new findings and then present and discuss some challenges in their various interpretations.

## Social Justice & Income Inequality - Feb. 9, 16, and 23
