DINNER A BIG SUCCESS; MISSION TRIP PREP FOR SENIOR HIGH

“We always appreciate the support of the parish,” said Youth Director **Kevin Williams**, “And I heard a lot of people say that the food was really good.” Kevin went on to report that the Senior High Youth Group Dinner, held annually to raise money for the Youth Group summer mission trip, served approximately 100 parishioners. “And a lot of the kids worked really hard,” he said, “from setup to cleanup five hours later.”

This summer the youth will be going to Rosebud Reservation, South Dakota, to work with the Lakota Sioux there. The Adult Mission trip has gone there for years. “We are learning a lot from the adults,” said Kevin. “They have been very helpful in our planning.”

Although the groups will be at Rosebud during the same time period they have separate goals. The adults are generally involved in home construction. The young people will be involved in some cleanup

and maintenance efforts, but their major emphasis will be on a week-long Vacation Bible School for youth ages 5-12 in the town of (coincidentally) Mission, S. D. “The youth are working very hard to develop the curriculum,” said Youth Leader **Ian MacBryde**. “Fortunately, Kevin and some of the other leaders have extensive experience in summer camps, and a number of the youth have shown that they are willing to think creatively about it.”

A part of the preparation for the trip was a viewing of the HBO production of Bury My heart at Wounded Knee, derived from the book of that name. It is a very sympathetic treatment of the Sioux position when they lost their native lands and many seemed resistant to assimilation into the “white” society.

The youth leave for their mission trip June 7 and return June 14.

Jr. High News

On **April 6** – the last Rite 13 session until after Easter – we started at the resurrection of Lazarus. We then rode on the back of a borrowed donkey over palm fronds to the cheers of people lining the road. We spoke of the feast of Maundy Thursday and the solemnity of the service which takes place following the dinner, as well as the garden at Gethsemane. This brought us to our pictorial rendition of the Stations of the Cross, starting with the conviction of Jesus and ending with the resurrection. At each station, we read captions and the children took turns offering the appropriate prayer.

Our “special” dinner scheduled for that evening had to be postponed and has now turned into a lunch/brunch on **May 4** from 10:15 – 11:45. Again, we need to know how many people will be attending so we will know how much food to buy and prepare.

Back to April. On the **27th**, our regular schedule will resume and, included in our Rite 13 lesson, will be preparation of the brown-bag lunches for the homeless shelter.



Also on **April 27**, there will be a meeting of Jr. Hi. youth, parents and leaders for a discussion of the upcoming mission trip. The youngsters will then stay at the church for “Mission Mania” until 3:30.

I know I speak for all the Jr. Hi. Youth leaders when I say how much we enjoy working with these kids. We send our appreciation to the parents who get them to the activities and to the parish for their support of all of us.

Vestry Vibes

The Vestry held its annual retreat on February 21 and 22 at Emmanuel. Our Saturday morning session focused on how we as a Vestry can help to make Emmanuel an even more welcoming and inclusive Christian community. After considerable discussion, we came up with a number of great ideas on how to achieve these goals. These “Actionable Items” included the following:

1. Reaching out to those outside of our own demographic and being especially mindful of those who are single/widowed/divorced, empty nesters, new parents, parents of small children and the unemployed. All of these conditions are stressful and potentially isolating experiences. Vestry members will focus on ways of inviting these people to remain active and connected to the Parish.
2. Being aware of “coupling” and consciously attempting to include those outside of our own circle of Emmanuel friends in our church lives and our lives beyond the Parish.

3. Meeting one newcomer a month, sending out one note a month and inviting someone we don’t know well to an event at church.

4. When making Sunday announcements at the 9 and 10:30 services, talking briefly about the ministries in which we as Vestry members are involved.

Adding Vestry members and Ministry Chairs to the newcomer ministry emails so that we may know and reach out to those who are new among us.

As the Vestry engages in these goals, we want to thank everyone who intentionally reaches out to people in these ways. And we invite the entire parish to join us in making Emmanuel a hospitable and welcoming church.

The New Addition is Almost Paid For

Thanks to your faithfulness and generosity, Emmanuel is almost finished paying for the new addition to the building. In order to finance the new addition, Emmanuel secured a loan from the diocese in the amount of \$ 800,000. In the few short years since the addition was completed, we have paid down \$ 713,250 of the loan with funds raised in the Behold campaign. We are eager to pay the remainder of the loan so that the diocese will be able to loan the funds to another parish.

By God’s grace, Emmanuel ended the last two years with an unplanned surplus over our budget. Of this surplus, the Vestry resolved to use \$70,000 to pay down the balance on the loan. That leaves only \$16,750 remaining to be paid. Pledges and additional gifts to the Behold campaign continue to come in. So, if you were waiting for the right time to fulfill your pledge, or if you would like to make

an additional gift, now is the time. We are hoping to have the loan paid off in the near future.

The Vestry is grateful to everyone who participated in the Behold campaign, those who continue to make their pledge payments, and those who have found it possible to make additional gifts.

A new part-time Assistant Priest

I have called **The Rev. Melanie Jianakopolos Slane** to join us at Emmanuel, as a half-time Assistant Priest at Emmanuel. Melanie is a native of Kirkwood, attending Grace Church as she grew up. She has a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with an emphasis in Management from the University of Missouri, Robert J. Trulaske, Sr. College of Business. She earned her Master of Divinity at Virginia Theological Seminary. From July 2009-June 2010, she served in the Episcopal Church's Young Adult Service Corps, Besao, Mountain Province, Philippines, an overseas version of the service offered by the members of Deaconess Anne House, in the North Side of the City of St. Louis. Since her graduation in 2013 she has served as Assistant Rector at the Church of the Epiphany, Washington, D.C. Melanie will be joining us in Mid-June.

A new Priest Associate

The Rev. Paul Metzler will be cementing his ties with us, by joining Warren and Rod to serve as Priest Associate, here. Before moving to St. Louis with our Assistant Priest, the Rev. Martie Metzler, Paul was *Director of Community and Program Services* for the Visiting Nurse Service of New York Hospice and Palliative Care, He previously served as Director of *The Center for Living with Loss*, sponsored by Hospice & Palliative Care Associates of Central New York (1993-2005) and the *Director of Education and Psychotherapy Training* at the Onondaga Pastoral Counseling Center (1979-1993), both in Syracuse, NY. He and I are in discussions about his "start time."

The position of Priest Associate is offered to retired clergy who wish to continue to serve the church in retirement. Their service is very limited and not paid. As is the case with Rod and Warren, Paul will not be involved in the pastoral care ministry of our parish. I anticipate that Paul will join Rod and Warren in assisting or celebrating at "the table"/altar once every 4 to 6 weeks and will be scheduled to preach periodically.

Temporary Staff Accountant

Ms. Dianne Klein will be filling in for Bill Simokaitis as Staff Accountant for the six weeks, while Bill is on a mission trip to Kenya. She returned to her native St Louis after a lifetime seeing the world as an Air Force spouse. Most recently, she was the Part Time Accountant at the Jewish Family & Children's Service in St Louis County. We look forward to working with Dianne, as she looks forward to meeting and working with everyone in the Emmanuel household.

Training for the Diaconate:

Kevin McGrane is continuing his formation through an intern year at **St. John's Church** in Tower Grove Park. **Jerre Birdsong** will be beginning his intern year at **Trinity Church** in the Central West End in mid-May. Both will be reviewed again by Commission on Ministry during the spring and are hoping to be ordained to the Diaconate at Diocesan Convention this November in Cape Girardeau, MO.

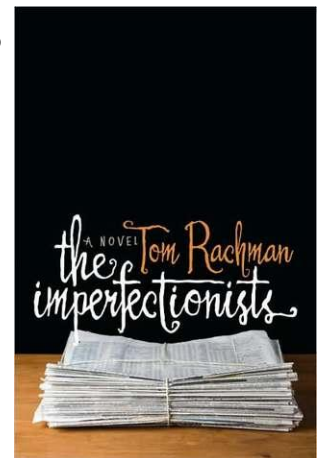
Emmanuel Women's Book Club
