Welcome to our new Tanzanian seminarian

On the 12th the Rev. Bethuel Mluma will arrive in Webster Groves to begin a two year Master of Theological Studies program. We hope that Emmanuel will become his church home away from home. Bethuel (pronounced BETH-well) is one of the senior clergy of the Diocese of Central Tanganyika, the mother diocese of the Anglican Church of Tanzania (ACT), which includes the area around Dodoma, the national capital. He has been a parish priest, dean of their cathedral, assistant to the General Secretary of the ACT, and is currently both a parish priest and principal of their Bible College (which is the pre-seminary

step towards ordination). He is not a stranger to North America in that he studied theology at the University of Toronto from 2004 to 2007. The Eden degree will allow him to teach theology at the University of Dodoma, which has some 40,000 students!

Bethuel is married to **Agnes** and they have two daughters finishing secondary school, ages 18 and 15.

I know that you will give him a warm Emmanuel welcome.

Emmanuel Book Club Monday, September 29 at 7:00 p.m.






