Christmas Day came and went, and still, hanging above the threshold to my living room is my home-made Advent calendar. Complete with varied chocolates wrapped in little red bags and Scripture readings corresponding to each day, is the Advent calendar that I had every intention of enjoying on the days



leading up to Christmas. But, here I sit, staring up at my Advent calendar, counting the little red bags that were opened in the month of December... one, two, three, four, five, six, seven. Seven whole days of Advent did I open those little bags, read the story and ponder what amazing new insights might lie in store for me as the coming of Jesus drew near.

Why hadn't I opened them, I thought. Why had I hung it, just to let it drape there until January? Why did I not eat all of those delicious chocolates that were right in front of my face? I let it soak in for a bit, as I rocked my baby back and forth, back and forth in our old wood rocking chair on our old wood floor. And then, like most Epiphanies, it all made sense. Advent didn't happen for me in December this year. This year, Advent came early.

Now, I don't know how many of you have been 43 weeks pregnant with a child, but I do know that most of you have been pregnant for just as long, or longer, with other possibilities. After all, you can be pregnant with thoughts, or hopes or fears or anxieties or joys or all sorts of other things that life brings. All of the waiting and anticipation, all of the wondering and planning, all of the prep work and excitement, you have all felt that at some point. It may have even given you heartburn and weird food cravings. And, as you waited for that day, that person, that event, that moment to arrive, you too were experiencing Advent, and Advent, I now know, can come at any time of the year.

The three weeks before my son arrived, I ate more chocolates than those little red bags could enclose, I read more Scripture than that little Advent calendar could grasp, and I prayed harder for his arrival than I have ever prayed for Christmas day. I was ready, tired and uncomfortable, nervous and excited; I just wanted to meet him.

Now, Advent for me this year was about meeting my son. It was and is glorious, wonderful, and joyous, but it is also challenging. It requires self-sacrifice and sleepless nights. It requires change and a new way of thinking. It requires a new way of life.

The Advent of Jesus requires the same. As we await the coming of Christ, we too must be ready for joy and wonder, challenge and change.

For a moment, as I stared up at that Advent calendar I felt like maybe I had missed it, like I had missed Jesus because I didn't open those little red bags, but that's not what had happened at all. I had found Jesus in the birth of my son, as the whole experience opened me up to a deeper love than I had ever felt before, a love that allowed me to release control and lean on God, a love that required me to give all of myself to another.

Advent came early for me this year, and just like those little blue, pink, and white candles that we light throughout the season, my heart grew brighter as the moment arrived when love meant more than ever before.

My prayer for you all as we begin 2015 is that you will welcome Advent whenever it comes to you, be it July or November, March or May. Remember, the light of Christ can come any day, and the love that it brings will bring us closer to God, and closer to one another. All we have to do is allow the waiting to interrupt our well-laid plans while we welcome with open arms the Advent that is meant for us when we least expect it.

The **Jan. 18th** Adult Forum will feature **Gerald Early** discussing Martin Luther King and the Meaning of Protest.






Emmanuel Book Club - January 26 at 7:00 p.m.

Emmanuel Women's Book Club starts off the new year on Monday evening, January 26 with William Kent Krueger's *Ordinary Grace*. This award-winning mystery novel was a New York Times Bestseller that won both the 2014 *Edgar Award* for Best Novel the 2014 *Dilys Award*. Here is what Booklist has to say about it:

Krueger has written a stand-alone novel that is part mystery but mostly an extended (and often overly extended) meditation. The narrator, Frank Drum, writes as a middle-age man looking back on a summer in 1961 in New Bremen, Minnesota, when he was 13; the Minnesota Twins were in their first season; and death, in five different instances, shook his family and their community in the Minnesota River valley. The first death is that of Frank's sometime friend Bobby Cole. The proximate cause was a train, but the mystery is whether Bobby stood in front of that train, or was pushed or placed there. More deaths follow, one of which rips apart Frank's family. This coming-of-age story is obviously an attempt to show how grace can work through the fissures of suffering.

If you'd like to get a head start on upcoming books, here are our next four selections: *Unbroken* by Laura Hillenbrand; *The Woman at the Light* by Joanna Brady; *I Am Malala* by Malala Yousafzai; and *Bel Canto* by Ann Patchett.

Soles help Souls -turning used shoes into water for those in need

During Advent the **Mission Committee** is having a collection of shoes as part of the **Shoeman Water Projects.** This organization based in Fenton gathers shoes not wore anymore and turns them into water!

The collected shoes are exported to street vendors in South America, Haiti, India, Kenya and other places where people need affordable shoes. The shoes are given to street vendors who sell them to those individuals who have no shoes for pennies on the dollar. The vendor has a job! And the money generated from exporting the shoes is used to purchase well drilling rigs, water purification systems, and other supplies to bring clean, fresh water to those who thirst!.

So bring the shoes you don't wear anymore, shoes that no longer fit, shoes you should have never bought and sit in the back of your closet as well as children's shoes. If the shoes have shoe strings tie them together and if there are no shoestrings use a rubber band to keep them together, Bring them to church and place them in the **Shoeman box** in the dining room anytime during Advent.
