A Walk in Creation

Recently, I had the exquisite pleasure of walking through gentle woods with a group of women, soaking up the beauty of creation and the companionship of friends. It was a lovely, quiet, walk, not an athletic event or a hike; a time to see and hear spring breaking into the creation. Bird calls, mayflowers, a little creek bed



of watercress, a big, enthusiastic dog who gave us the vicarious pleasure of watching him wallow in the creek.... Although I kept half an eye out, and mayflowers are said to portend the presence of morels, no mushrooms were found. We took "nothing but pictures"; left "nothing but footprints," in John Muir's parlance. It was just a time to soak up the beauty and splendor of God's handiwork, including, most certainly, the sisters with whom I walked.

For a while we walked right along the banks of the wide Missouri River, where I recalled the diaries of the Pioneer women who began their treacherous journey to Oregon on the very waters I watched from the safety of a rock ledge.

Returning to the comfort of our hostess' log cabin we reveled in the handiwork of her grandfather who in the 1930s, employed construction techniques and styles typical for a 19th Century Missouri cabin, completely congruent with its woodland site. Such a labor of love long ago, created our shelter when a spring shower drove us indoors.

I won't deny that it was a great bonus to share a delectable lunch, a little woman-made treat in the midst of all that God-made natural beauty. Although we did not pray, or even mention God, for me it was a holy day, permeated with a sense of reverence. I returned from the woods filled with gratitude, and feeling connected; connected to my dear sisters with whom I traveled to that spot of beauty; connected to the creation in the intimacy of a wildflower and in the majesty of the rolling river; connected to our forbears who paved the way for us; connected to God, the ultimate author

of all these good things. Perhaps the sense of connection to those things so much greater than ourselves is the very definition of reverence.

When Moses encountered the holy, he took off his shoes in reverence. May I, and we, walk lightly, and reverently, over all holy manifestations of creation by which we are blessed.



Month of Guided Prayer is Coming to Emmanuel!

Want to deepen your prayer life? Would you like to learn about how God is active in your life? Then the Month of Guided Prayer, or A Retreat in Everyday Life may be for you!

Coming this fall (October 18 to November 15) to Emmanuel Episcopal Church and co-hosted by Christ Lutheran Church of Webster Groves, the Month of Guided Prayer is an ecumenical retreat program for adults that is personalized to fit your spiritual needs.

What is a Month of Guided Prayer, you may ask? It is a retreat in which one doesn't have to travel, or take time off, or stop one's regular lifestyle and commitments. Rather, a Month of Guided Prayer (or MGP) is an opportunity to grow closer to God while continuing one's job, parenting, retirement, or what have you!

What does a Month of Guided Prayer involve? Making a commitment to pray 20 minutes a day for one month, and meeting with a prayer guide once a week (or four times total) during that month. Prayer Guides are usually trained spiritual directors who are experienced at accompanying others in their faith journeys.

Emmanuel's and Christ Church Lutheran's MGP will begin and end with a 90-minute session at Emmanuel on October 18 and November 15. In between those dates, retreatants will meet one-on-one with their prayer guides in private spaces at Christ Lutheran Church.

There is no registration cost for a Month of Guided Prayer, but participants are invited to make a freewill offering to offset the costs of the retreat, which usually runs about \$48/person.
