Melanie's Article

Inquiry is a dangerous thing, but then, so is love. Just as C.S. Lewis writes of Aslan in The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, something or someone does not have to be safe to be good.

Asking tough questions can be a dangerous venture, but it can also be incredibly life-giving. One thing that I love about the Episcopal Church is our freedom to ask tough questions, and to often leave conversations with more questions than definitive



answers. I am thankful for a faith that does not tell me what to think, but rather asks me to consider Scripture, reason, and tradition when building a foundation for my beliefs, as an individual and as a member of a community.

Over the years I have had many friends and family members who argue that the Via Media stance of the Episcopal Church leads to a faith that has no root, no doctrine. But I know that this could not be further from the truth. The Episcopal Church is very clear about what it believes and what it doesn't, while at the same time allowing for many opinions within the spectrum. This freedom allows us to worship with people of many faiths from all over the world and at the same time stand in church on Sunday and say the Nicene Creed with honesty and confidence. This freedom allows us to sit next to one another, shoulder to shoulder, in the pews of our church, while our political ideologies would keep us separated left from right. This freedom allows for some of us to believe in the virgin birth while others hold firm to the impossibility of such a divine intervention.

Inquiry, investigation, tough questions are not safe, but they are good. Just like God, and just like the Gospel of Jesus Christ, we are invited to struggle toward goodness, not safety. We are asked not to sit idly by while pain and violence rage in our cities, in our schools, and in our homes, but rather to, "Seek the truth. Come whence it may; cost what it will."



Emmanuel, Mark Your Calendar!



Jr. High News






