Dear Friends,

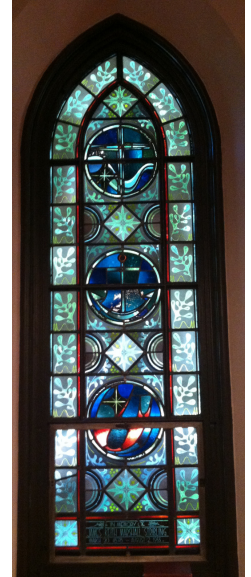
Last Sunday we celebrated the Feast of Pentecost. The stories in the Gospel of John surrounding this “Birthday of the Church” include images of a small group of people, frustrated and hiding and weak and confused – a description of Jesus’ followers, fearful of the future, struggling to find confidence. But then, Luke tells us of an excited group of followers, gathered together, waiting expectantly for a sense of mission and purpose that they know will come; which will unleash them on the world with great confidence – a description of the church empowered to serve and heal the world in Christ’s name.

Whether we’re talking about a church that is weak and confused, or strong and expectant, what ties these two accounts together is that the Spirit is given by God as it is needed. Whatever we need in order to do what God asks of us, God has already given to us. The church has everything it needs to do its job. That’s what Paul speaks of in his wonderful passage about gifts. Varieties of gifts, varieties of services, varieties of activities, all energized and activated by the same God. God gives us the gifts we need to do the work that lies before us.

But rather than thinking of gifts as something we have, what if we were to think of gifts as something that we are. Rather than thinking of gifts as our abilities, maybe we would be better served to think of gifts as our very nature. We are, each and every one of us, God’s gift to the universe; God’s gift to one another.

Think about that for a moment. Let it really sink in: This congregation is unique and whatever we have to contribute to this world is completely and totally unprecedented. Each and every one of you are unique and whatever you have to contribute to this world is completely and totally unprecedented.

I while ago, I shared with some of you how Martha Graham, artist and dancer, articulated this idea: “There is a vitality, a life force, a quickening that is translated through you into action, and because there is only one of you in all time, this expression is unique. If you block it, it will never exist through any other medium and be lost. The world will not have it.


“It is not your business to determine how good your gift is; nor how valuable it is; nor how it compares with other expressions. It is your business to keep it yours, clearly and directly, to keep the channel open. You do not even have to believe in yourself or your work. You have to keep directly open to and aware of the urges that motivate you. Keep the channel open. No artist is pleased. There is no satisfaction at any time. There is only a ... (strange), divine dissatisfaction; a blessed unrest that keeps us marching and makes us more alive than the others.”

There is only one of you in all time. Think about that. Whatever you have to offer, no matter what you may think of it, no matter how insignificant it might seem to you, it is all a part of God's gift to the world.

When we begin to see ourselves and one another in this way, as gifts from God to the world and to one another, imagine how our relationships will be transformed. Through us God's love for all can be made known. Each and every last one of us are expressions of that vitality, that life force, that quickening, expressions of the Spirit that is nothing less than the all embracing love of God. It is through us that the Spirit gets translated into action, expressions that are unique and unprecedented.

That's the message of Pentecost... A people given by God as gifts to one another and, more importantly, as gifts to the world. Never forget that. You are God's gifts! You are God's own household, given for the world – given for all of God's children – given for all people. Never forget that you are the gifts of God – the Gifts of God for the People of God.

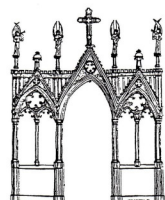



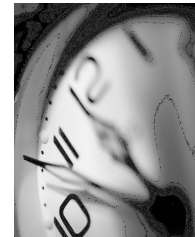
