Two things – As I was preparing for my vacation in mid-July and this edition of the Angelus, I decided to put together a summary of some of the legislation passed at General Convention. Also, as you receive this, the anniversary of the death of Michael Brown will be approaching. So, I decided to focus on these two very different topics. Perhaps the glue that holds them both together is that our new Presiding Bishop-elect Michael Curry recently challenged the Episcopal Church at our gathering in Salt Lake City, saying, "Go forth, go forth, go forth into this world and proclaim that love is the only way. Go forth and proclaim that we will end the scourge of violence, we will make poverty history, and we will end racism, because we all got one God who created us and we are all children of that one God, and we are brothers and sisters one of another, and all lives matter."

The 78th General Convention's actions included:

- taking a step toward revising the 1979 Book of Common Prayer and The Hymnal 1982, by directing the Standing Commission on Liturgy and Music (SCLM) to prepare plans for revising each and to present them to the next convention in Austin, Texas, in 2018.
- In the wake of the June 26 U.S. Supreme Court ruling legalizing same-sex marriage for all Americans, General Convention followed suit on July 1 with canonical and liturgical changes to provide marriage equality for Episcopalians. The House of Deputies concurred with the House of Bishops' approval the day before of a canonical change eliminating language defining marriage as between a man and a woman (Resolution A036) and authorizing two new marriage rites with language allowing them to be used by same-sex or opposite-sex couples (Resolution A054). Both resolutions say that clergy retain the canonical right to refuse to officiate at any wedding.

Resolution A030, calls for the creation of a climate change advisory committee with one representative from each of The Episcopal Church's nine provinces. The resolution also calls on each province to create a Regional Consultative Group composed "of no fewer than five experts in areas of environmental sustainability appropriate to the demographic, ecological, cultural and geographic specifics of each region."

With the nation's racial tensions boiling, the 78th General Convention of The Episcopal Church has spoken in a big way about its priorities, earmarking \$2 million for racial justice and reconciliation work in the next triennium.

When you receive this Angelus, all of us in St. Louis are anticipating the anniversary of the killing of Michael Brown. A group of religious leaders that I am a part of are preparing a letter to our region. Although I expect any number of edits before it is released, one of its paragraphs reads:

"While we lament the ways in which our town is structured, we find hope in the fact that as it has been structured, it can be dismantled and rebuilt. Our diverse religious traditions bear witness to the work of God's people in this kind of collaborative redemption with the Creator.

In working for justice for the poor, the Prophet Isaiah promised Israel, "your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in"(Isaiah 58:12).

In proclaiming the Kingdom of God, Jesus crossed boundaries of ethnic, cultural, and economic disparity to challenge oppressive systems, and extend God's healing and wholeness for all people (Mark 1:14-8:26). A Saying of the Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him, reminds us: If you see injustice, it is your duty/ responsibility to correct it by hand, then by word, and lastly to condemn it by your heart. Baha'i, Buddhist, Hindu and other religious (and non-religious traditions) all believe in the oneness of humankind and that we are all deeply connected.

It is only when we embrace all, through compassionate acts, that we will be able to advance humankind to that spiritual level—social maturity for which we all yearn. We believe the Divine is calling us in St. Louis to just this kind of redemptive work of dismantling structural racism and rebuilding our community as a place in which all people, and most especially Black people, can live, grow, and thrive."

Thank you to all who contributed to the **Rebuild the Churches** fund; an effort begun by Christ Church Cathedral to assist in the rebuilding of black parishes recently burned by arson. An interfaith Advisory Committee, convened by Mike Kinman, is making decisions about the distribution of funds and working with the clergy leaders of the designated congregations to ensure the needed funds get allocated in ways which are most helpful to the struggling churches.

The fundraiser, which began as a local effort and an initial goal of \$25,000.00 has grown to include contributing congregations from across the country and a target goal of \$250,000. (Check out their FB page).

A check for <u>\$1559.00 from Emmanuel parishioners</u> was sent to join with others who believe that "*what hate burns down, love rebuilds*".



Shortly after the events in Ferguson in 2014, a group of women from various churches who were members of a weekly Bible study that had been meeting for a number of years decided to take action. This group included Emmanuel's Allison Williams & Kathleen Martin. Their goal was to engage Christian women of diverse backgrounds coming together to foster understanding and develop relationships through reflection and dialog. Most of all they wanted to be inclusive & diverse.

So, December 12, 2014 they had their first 'workshop' at Eden Commons which included a speaker, spiritual reflections, dinner and conversations. Since then, they've continued to meet bi-monthly on Friday evenings to share a meal, have a speaker, share reflections, and dialog with one another.

The group named themselves <u>Sisters: Christians Advocating for Racial Equality</u>. You can find out more by visiting Facebook Sisters Care (look for the logo!) or by emailing allfaithwomen@gmail.com.

MUSIC NOTES.....As part of a recent staff review and development of strategic goals for the Music Program, a detailed analysis of offertory anthems sung by Emmanuel Choir during the past 3 years was conducted. The results are:

- **52%** Living or 20th century composer
- **15%** 19th century composers (Western European Romantic works, including Dvorak & Brucker)
- 8% 18th century composers (including Haydn)
- 19% all previous centuries (Bach, Handel, Weelkes, Farrant, Tudor church anthems Renaissance motets or chant)
- 6% un-attributed or undocumented (spiritual arrangements or multi-cultural, etc.)

In summary, about half are works by living or 20th century composers; 19% represent a concerted effort to cultivate an appreciation for traditional Anglican & Protestant music. Further exploration & description of upcoming anthems will appear in subsequent issues of the Angelus. Stay tuned!




