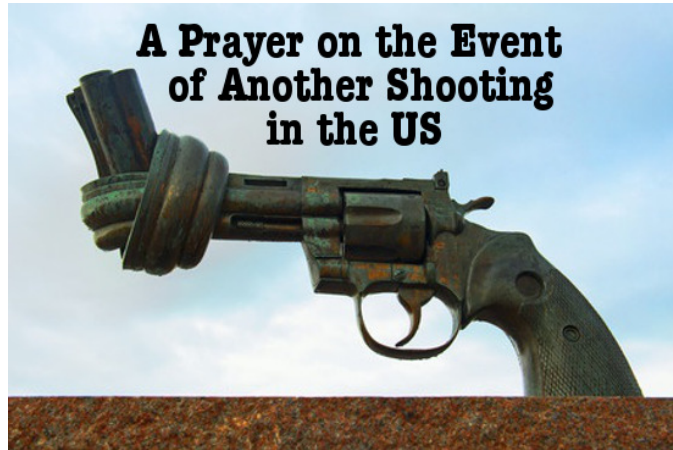

This bold graphic directed my attention to “ A Prayer on the Event of Another Shooting in the US.” The prayer begins,

“Yet again,
our nation grieves.
Yet again,
a life
has been cut
dreadfully short.”

The reference was to the shooting of two newscasters reporting live on video as they were killed by a disgruntled former colleague, a horrific spectacle, indeed. Unfortunately, this is no more horrific than the shooting of a Houston Deputy Sheriff or Sunday’s shooting on Cherokee Street in St. Louis.

The way the article was written, one might get the impression that the nation doesn’t daily grieve over lives cut dreadfully short by gun violence. It’s probably true.

Although daily, lives, often young lives, are cut short by gun violence, we develop numbness to it; compassion fatigue may be one term to describe it. With so many shootings, if we let ourselves feel the effect of so much violence, often to innocent bystanders, we would hardly be able to bear it. Like the families who are hardly able to bear it, every day.

In St. Louis, alone, homicides so far this year total 135, up from 71 during the first seven months of 2014 and 50 in the first seven months of 2013. That doesn’t include anyone killed in North County or South County or West County. It doesn’t include anyone killed in southern Missouri, or in Memphis or in Chicago, Los Angeles or anywhere else in our country.

Reading about the shooting of the TV reporters in Virginia, and seeing the responses of shock, outrage, and compassion online, my first impulse was that we should put something on our website—a prayer, or something....Then I realized, this killing differs from thousands of others we ignore, only by its visibility due to media reporting. Our shock, our outrage, our compassion needs to be an everyday reaction to the violence all around us; a reaction that moves us to prayer and action.

Without even looking at the news, it would be safe for us to say every single day,

“Yet again,
A life
has been cut
dreadfully short.”

When will we be able to say that we grieve everyone of them enough to do something about it?

The prayer concludes,

“We must act in love...
So, we ask
that we might be filled with the Spirit
and that from all of us
there might come
a great outpouring of love
on a scale like never seen before—
because our friends matter,
our children matter—
your children matter. Amen”

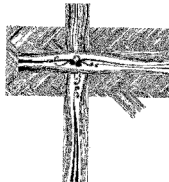
