

The prayer concludes,

"We must act in love... So, we ask that we might be filled with the Spirit and that from all of us there might come a great outpouring of love on a scale like never seen before because our friends matter, our children matter. Amen"

Want to deepen your prayer life? Would you like to learn about how God is active in your life? Then, Month of Guided Prayer or a Retreat in Everyday Life may be for you!
