Dear Friends,

When I was a little girl my mom and dad used to hand me a quarter, or even sometimes a dollar bill just before the offering was collected in big shiny brass platters at the Episcopal Church in which I was raised. Every Sunday I would wait for them to hand me some money so that I, soon after, could give it to someone else, so that they could give it to someone else, so that they could give it to those in need. This chain of giving was not lost to me even from a very young age. I knew that the money I put in that plate would go to the Church and the Church would find a way to use it to give back to the world.

It felt right to give. It felt good. And it felt easy. It took me years to realize that this was due, in part to the fact that it wasn’t really my money. Of course it was easy to give. I hadn’t worked for it, and I was pretty sure it still grew on trees at that point.

In college, I got my first real job, where I earned money to pay for books and food. Working as a barista at Starbucks was enjoyable work, but 3:30am came too early, especially on days when I had been up late studying or writing papers for class. It was the first time in my life that I really worked for the money I had in my pocket, and giving it away was not an easy decision. It was not easy to spend eight dollars once I understood that the same eight dollars took an hour of work to earn.

One Sunday morning while attending worship during “Stewardship Season” at Calvary Episcopal Church, a very sweet older woman from the church made an announcement in the service that went a little something like this...

“If someone gave you ten dollars and you could either spend it on something you wanted, or something that someone else needed, what would you do? Easy. You would give it away. It wasn’t yours in the first place. Now, if you worked for ten dollars and you could either spend it on something you wanted, or give it to someone who needed it, what would you do? Easy. You would give it away, because all that you have, your body with which you work, and your mind with which you think, they weren’t yours in the first place.”

It was not as easy this time around; but it still felt good and it still felt right to give a portion of what I had to someone else, so that they in turn could give it to someone else, so that they could give it to those in need.

On Sunday, September 27<sup>th</sup>, we begin our season of stewardship at Emmanuel Church and I encourage each of you to give thanks for what you have been given by giving some of what you have to others in the form of time, talent, and treasures. It is not always easy to give, but it always good and it is always right.

### Can We Talk?

Adult Forum Begins Sept. 20  
**It's time we had a talk. Lots of talks, in fact.** Talks at Adult Forum, set to start on September 20th. We begin after the 9:00 a.m. service most Sundays in the dining room. Generally, we'll start our sessions with refreshments and announcements from 10:15 - 10:25 a.m., with a program following from 10:25 - 11:15 or 11:30 a.m.

This year, our Forum topics will address themes that matter to our Church and our Community outside our doors. We'll cover topics such as social justice, outreach performed by parishioners and the residents of Deaconess Anne House, the arts as manifested in our worship, the workings of the Church at large, and so much more.

*The first three weeks look like this:*

**September 20th** kicks off the Fall Forums with a favorite presentation: The Senior High Mission Trip.

**September 27th** Dan Appleyard and Peg Cooper will present: General Convention, the Episcopal Church Women's Triennial and the United Thank Offering - A Church Gathers. We will review the election of the new Presiding Bishop, resolutions passed and debated and the mission and ministry of the ECW and UTO.

**October 4th** A Month of Guided Prayer Retreat in Everyday Life, presented by Clarence Heller. Jesus' closest friends asked him how to pray, and that question lingers with us today. A retreat in everyday life offers a venue to explore this question with grace, love, honesty, intimacy and courage. Come learn more about this retreat opportunity and get a taste of some prayer techniques that may be new to you. Clarence has served as the coordinator for the ecumenical retreat in everyday life ministry, Week or Month of Guided Prayer, for the past ten years. ## Month of Guided Prayer is Coming to Emmanuel!

*Want to deepen your prayer life? Would you like to learn about how God is active in your life? Then the Month of Guided Prayer, or A Retreat in Everyday Life may be for you!*

**Coming this fall (October 18 to November 15)** to Emmanuel Episcopal Church and co-hosted by Christ Lutheran Church and Sts. Clare and St. Francis, ECC, all in Webster Groves, the Month of Guided Prayer is an ecumenical retreat program for adults that is personalized to fit your spiritual needs.

What is a Month of Guided Prayer, you may ask? It is a retreat in which one doesn't have to travel, or take time off, or stop one's regular lifestyle and commitments. Rather, a Month of Guided Prayer (or MGP) is an opportunity to grow closer to God while continuing one's job, parenting, retirement, or what have you!

What does a Month of Guided Prayer involve? Making a commitment to pray 20 minutes a day for one month, and meeting with a prayer guide once a week (or four times total) during that month. (If you are not able to meet with your prayer guide in person, it is possible to "meet" via phone or Skype). Prayer Guides are usually trained spiritual directors who are experienced at accompanying others in their faith journeys.

**The retreat will begin at Emmanuel Episcopal at 3 PM on Sunday, October 18,** where we will gather for prayer and each participant will meet his/her prayer guide (gathering lasts about 90 minutes). Confidential, one-on-one meetings between retreatants and prayer guides will occur in private spaces on Thursdays in the mornings, afternoon and evenings at Christ Lutheran Church in Webster Groves.


**The closing of the retreat will be celebrated as a group at 3 PM on Sunday, November 15 at Sts. Francis and Clare, ECC in Webster Groves (Peace UCC) and will last about 90 minutes.** You may still participate in the retreat even if you are not able to attend the opening and closing sessions.

There is no registration cost for a Month of Guided Prayer, but participants are invited to make a freewill offering to offset the costs of the retreat, which usually runs about \$48/person.

*Want to learn more?* There will be brochures about the upcoming Month of Guided Prayer at Emmanuel in the Narthex or on the brochure shelf in the dining room. 




