Dear Friends,

By now you have received a letter from our Fall Campaign chairs, Tricia Copeland and Al Ludwig. Our theme for this year is **“Together Met – Together Bound,”** which celebrates our bonds as a community at Emmanuel and invites you into generously supporting our parish financially. You will see videos and be invited to a number of parish events. A narrative budget will explain how your contributions support the ministries that sustain our mission as a parish to be Deep in Faith, Rich in Love and Bold Mission.

Some of us are new to a life shaped by Stewardship and some are not. Over 25 years ago, as Elizabeth and I were beginning our lives together, we talked a lot about how we would be stewards of our household and how it would reflect the values that we held dear. 



Spiritual Opportunities in October

Month of Guided Prayer

Month of Guided Prayer starts **Sunday October 18 at 3:00 p.m. at** Emmanuel Episcopal Church. Emmanuel along with Christ Lutheran Church and Sts. Clare and St. Francis, ECC, will participate in a Month of Guided Prayer; an ecumenical retreat program for adults that is personalized to fit your spiritual needs.

A Month of Guided Prayer (MGP) is a retreat that provides busy folks the opportunity to grow closer to God while continuing one's job, parenting, or retirement!

MGP involves making a commitment to pray 20 minutes a day for one month, and meeting with a prayer guide for one hour a week (four times total) during that month. (If you are not able to meet with your prayer guide in person, it is possible to "meet" via phone or Skype). Prayer Guides are usually trained spiritual directors who are experienced at accompanying others in their faith journeys.

On Sunday **October 18** we will gather for prayer and each participant will meet his/her prayer guide (gathering lasts about 90 minutes). Confidential, one-on-one meetings between retreatants and prayer guides will occur in private spaces on Thursdays in the mornings, afternoon and evenings at Christ Lutheran Church in Webster Groves.

The closing of the retreat will be celebrated as a group at 3 PM on Sunday, November 15 at Sts. Francis and Clare, ECC in Webster Groves (Peace UCC) and will last about 90 minutes. You may still participate in the retreat even if you are not able to attend the opening and closing sessions.

There is no registration cost for a Month of Guided Prayer, but participants are invited to make a freewill offering to offset the costs of the retreat, which usually runs about \$48/person. Brochures are available in the Narthex, on the website and in the brochure rack in the dining room. Or you can visit <http://www.weekofguidedprayer.org>.




Bill Simokaitis's Last Day as Asst. Treasurer at Emmanuel is Thursday October 8th

Emmanuel Women's Book Club meets on Monday evening, October 26 to discuss *The All-Girl Filling Station's Last Reunion* by the ever-popular Fannie Flagg. Here's what Booklist has to say about it:

Aging daughter of the South Sookie Simmons Poole has trudged along cheerfully through life under the shadow of her overbearing mother, Lenore. Faced with empty-nest syndrome, Sookie knows she won't be too bored, since Lenore lives right next door and still has her mail delivered to Sookie's house. When a mysterious letter arrives, Sookie questions everything she ever knew about her family, and her story soon dovetails with that of a proud Polish family from Wisconsin.

The Jurdabralinskis' gas station was nearly shuttered when all the area men joined up during WWII, but the family's four girls bravely stepped up. Eldest daughter Fritzzi was already a great mechanic, having been a professional stunt plane pilot in the 1930s. When Fritzzi joins the WASPS, an elite but downplayed female branch of the U.S. Air Force, the story really comes to life. Flagg's storytelling talent is on full display. Her trademark quirky characters are warm and realistic, and the narrative switches easily between the present and the past.




