Dear Friends,

A few of my favorite quotes that focus on Stewardship and the Christian Life:

William Stringfellow wrote that: *"In truth, all human beings are called to be saints, but that means called to be fully human, to be perfect – that is, whole, mature, fulfilled. The saints are simply those men and women who relish the event of life as a gift and who realize that the only way to honor such a gift is to give it away."*

Abolitionist Henry Ward Beecher once said: *"In the world, it is not what we take up, but what we give up that makes us rich."*

Elizabeth Bibesco wrote: *"Blessed are those who give without remembering and take without forgetting."*

Saint Augustine of Hippo reminds us that: *"God is always trying to give good things to us, but our hands are too full to receive them."*

Martin Luther said: *"I have held many things in my hands, and I have lost them all. But, whatever I have placed in God's hands - that I still possess."*

In her diary, Anne Frank wrote *"No one has ever become poor by giving."*

Join Us at the Mardi Gras Creative Meetings


Every Wednesday till Thanksgiving week!!
