Preparing for Holy Week 2016

The opposite of LOVE is FEAR. When we are afraid we are not free to act in love. When we are afraid, we act defensively, and hostilely. When we are afraid we tend to hunker down to protect the status quo. Sometimes Truth, Justice, and people are sacrificed because of fear.

The authorities of the Empire, the Jewish collaborators for the empire, and the Temple leaders were afraid of Jesus. They were afraid he would usurp their authority, their influence, their power.

Remember Herod, the Jewish (puppet) king who was so afraid of the Wisemen's tale of a new King of the Jews that he had all the male infants slaughtered? Remember Pilate, cowed by the crowd's demands to crucify even though he saw no truth in the accusations? Remember the Pharisees cooking up plots against Jesus from the time he started putting human need above purity laws? They were afraid that too many people were following Jesus instead of themselves, afraid that if the purity laws were not kept that the messiah would never come, afraid of new ideas that challenged their perspective.

Jesus was not afraid. Jesus demonstrated perfect love in the face of dire threats; love to Jews, Romans, Samaritans, the sick, the lame, the lepers, to women and children, all of which incited hostility.

He set his mind on Jerusalem and what he must do there, knowing full well how it would end. He told the truth to any power within hearing range, and demonstrated the truth of God's love for all among the populace so that it could not be kept secret. Doing this he made people so afraid for their systems of belief and power that he was killed for it.

Jesus emanated love rather than fear even while he was being killed; loved the thieves next to him, loved the few who stood nearby him at the cross, showing compassion to his mother and friend, loved God. Through his ultimate gesture of love, he demonstrated that even death is not something to be feared, for God will triumph over even death, and so shall we.

As we listen to the news, as we hear the cries of the disposed, as we prepare to vote, may we pray to be like Jesus, to be motivated by love, not fear. May God's love fill your heart this Holy week and through the Easter Season.

UTO Refugee Ingathering Update

Thanks to the generosity of the hundreds who contributed and participated in a United Thank Offering challenge during Advent, nearly \$90,000 will be dedicated to the work of welcoming refugees coming to the United States.

In December 2015, the United Thank Offering issued a challenge of \$30,000 to assist Episcopal Migration Ministries. Named *Advent: Journey from Gratitude to Hope*, \$59,054.20 was generously donated to the challenge. As a result, a total of \$89,054.20 will be earmarked for the work of Episcopal Migration Ministries. Donors from Emmanuel gave \$4395.00!

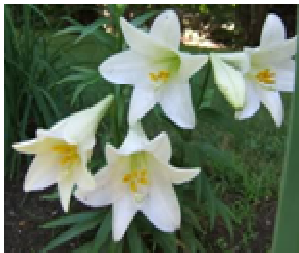
Types of shoes to donate include: sneakers, sandals, flip-flops, pumps, heels, work boots, athletic, cleats.

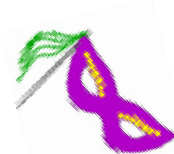
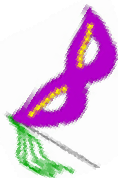
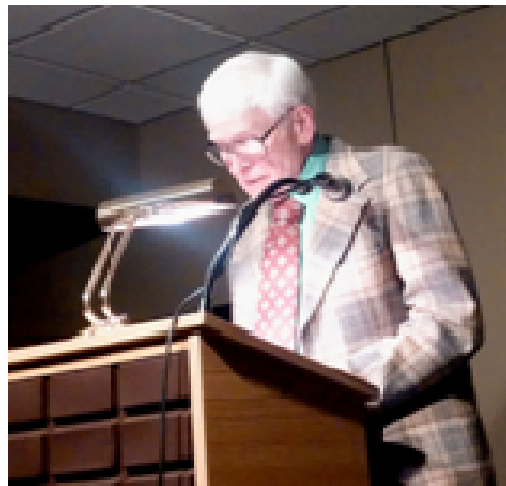
Emmanuel's Participation in OUR W-RHM Building Project

We recently sent out a letter asking for contributions to Emmanuel's pledge for the Webster Rock Hill Ministries Building Addition Project. As announced at this year's Annual Meeting, this project was birthed by the four Webster Groves churches with sesquicentennials in 2016. Webster Rock Hill Ministries' building was erected in 1992 as part of the same four churches' 125th celebrations. After 25 years, they need more space ... not a lot of space, but enough to have food storage separate from their only meeting room, and to house tutoring and summer camp! It seemed appropriate that once again, we all work together to help the community at large.

The building addition will cost approximately \$288,000, and as of February the fund-raising efforts were off to an incredible start thanks to two grants (one from Episcopal Presbyterian Health Trust). In addition to grants, the OUR fund raising committee has reached out to all the religious organizations in Webster as well as members of those organizations.

Emmanuel's vestry voted to support a contribution goal of \$25,000 to be comprised of individual donations and \$5,000 from Missions Committee. In addition, proceeds from Mardi Gras 2016 were designated for this project in memory of Judd Holt. As noted below, that effort brought in \$2,500. So, we are well on our way to meeting our goal. The building addition will house the new low-power community service Radio 63119 which has to be up and operational by July 1, 2016, which means construction needs to start! It's anticipated that construction will start shortly after Easter. We've asked for donations from Emmanuel by then as well. However, we know that timing is short, so we will keep going until we reach our goal. We appreciate everyone's participation, and we hope to report progress very soon. Emmanuel’s Apple Orchard

Dale Penrose presented a proposal to the Facilities Management Team to plant apple trees in the ‘lower forty,’ the area between the parking lot and the “Y” at Big Bend and Lockwood. The Facilities Management Team, led by Dave Pluhar and Paul LaFata, discussed the proposal and ultimately agreed that Dale and Emmanuel would plant the trees. On Tuesday, March 8, the apple trees arrived, and Dale rushed out in the unusually warm sunshine to get them in the ground! There are 15 trees in 14 different varieties ranging from old to new varieties of semi-dwarf trees. They should begin producing fruit in three years and will be fully mature in five years.

Once the trees produce fruit, we will be able to provide fresh fruit to the Emmanuel Food Center, Webster Rock Hill Ministries, and other ministries. In the future, Dale would like to make applesauce and apple cider! Knowing Dale he’s got a plan in his head already to make that happen. The orchard is situated in the area that was the original settlement of Old Orchard, on land owned by Richard and Angelica Lockwood, and in front of the Lockwood home, which is behind Nerinx Hall. With these new apple trees we are returning to our roots!

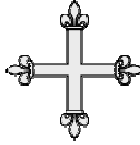

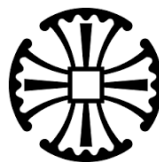
