Chrysostom accomplished exactly that in one of his Easter sermons. Like a tent revival preacher, "John of the Golden Tongue," as he became known, could draw his listeners into a vision of new life with just a word or a turn of a phrase. Even though his view of the world may seem as foreign and ancient as the 1500 years that separate him from us now living in the 21st century, listen to his anticipation of joy and wholeness winning out over the powers of darkness and despair:

"...Let no one fear death, for the death of our Saviour has set us free.

The Lord has destroyed death by enduring it. The Lord vanquished hell when he descended into it... Hell was in turmoil having been eclipsed. Hell was in turmoil having been mocked. Hell was in turmoil having been destroyed. Hell was in turmoil having been abolished. Hell was in turmoil having been made captive. Hell grasped a corpse, and met God. Hell seized earth, and encountered heaven. Hell took what it saw, and was overcome by what it could not see.

O death, where is your sting? O hell, where is your victory?




