Change. Change is a scary word, except when it isn't. The word change brings both anxiety about what might come next and the beauty of discovering something new. Change is often resisted, but it comes to us whether we want it to or not. Our relationships change, our bodies change, our imaginations change. Some change is good and some change is hard, but regardless of the outcome, change, in and of itself, is inevitable. The seasons change, our children grow, and our community of faith gains and loses members every year. None of us are the same as we were last week, last year, last decade. We learn, we grow, we acquire new skills, we meet new people and visit new worlds.

Change, it has been said, is not painful, but rather our resistance to change is what brings us grief. We want to be more than what we are now, but we don't want to let go of what we have become. We seek to move forward, but are weighed down by the baggage we carry from our past.

We may carry on like this for a good long while until some external force pushes us into unfamiliar territory: a new job, a new city, a new friend, a new church, a new life. Many of the changes in my life have come not purely from my own initiative, but from the passing of time. Growing up, moving away from home, getting married, having children, all of these were both a decision to change and a force brought about by the passage of time. And time, as we know "goes not backward, nor tarries with yesterday." We can bring about change, or wait for something to change us, but moved or mover, change is a part of our lives.

Think of your life. How have you changed? What have you learned, experienced, put your heart and soul into? What is still left undone? What do you hope to accomplish in the years you have left? How will you show the love of Christ as you move forward as an individual, a family, a church? What will we look like next week, next year, next decade?

How do we advance confidently in the direction of our dreams when we just aren't sure what the road will look like? The answer, I think, lies within a prayer from our order for Compline (BCP pg. 127)

"Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this life may rest in your eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

Hold on to that which never changes: the love of God. God is present with us in the steady and calm times of our lives, and God is with us in the turbulent and terrifying times too. We may be wearied by the changes and chances that life brings, but constantly and consistently, God is with us. God's love for us never wavers, and God's grace never ceases to exist. Rest in the changelessness of God's great love for us and find that change really is nothing to be feared.

They provide job opportunities and income to people living in the economically depressed area of the reservation. The Adult Missioners will take the fabric with them when they travel there June 11 through 18.


We need any cotton or cotton blend fabric at least 1/4 yard long and any color or pattern. These are pictures of some of the quilts that have been made at Harvest Wind.

We look forward to worshipping and singing at Emmanuel.



Emmanuel Women's Book Club has just one more book before summer break, <u>The Professor and the Madman</u> by Simon Winchester. Here's an edited version of a review on amazon.com: *When the editors* 

of the Oxford English Dictionary put out a call during the late 19th century pleading for "men of letters" to help with their mammoth undertaking, hundreds of responses came forth. Some provided several thousand entries to the editors, but none more than Dr. W. C. Minor, an American Civil War veteran and English expatriate, who was actually a certified lunatic....his dictionary entries were created in the Broadmoor Criminal Lunatic Asylum! While producing a mesmerizing coda to the doctor's deeply troubled life, Simon Winchester also paints a rich portrait of the OED's leading light, Professor James Murray, who spent more than 40 years of his life on a project he would not see completed in his lifetime.
