For the month of May the food center is asking for contributions of **cereal** to maintain our shelf stock. Please consider a donation to assist those of our community in need.



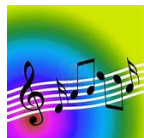

## The Emmanuel Team for Peace Meal at St. John’s Tower Grove Needs Volunteers

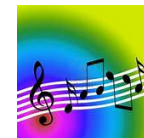

# SUMMER CELEBRATION

## Music Program Update



In the spring of 2015, the clergy and music staff took part in a general review and brainstorming session focused on the music program at Emmanuel. This process took several months. As part of our assessment, our Rector suggested that we do a compilation of type of anthems which had been sung by the Emmanuel Choir. We thought you might like to see the results:



### April 2011 - June 2015:

- 52% - living or 20<sup>th</sup> century composers
- 15% - 19<sup>th</sup> century composers (Western European Romantic works, including Dvorak and Bruckner)
- 8% - 18<sup>th</sup> century composers (including Haydn)
- 19% - all previous centuries (Bach, Handel, Tudor church anthems, Renaissance motets or chant)
- 6% - unattributed or undocumented (spiritual arrangements, multi-cultural, folk song origin, etc.)

### For the most recent choir season (2015-16):

- 56% - living or 20<sup>th</sup> century composers
- 8% - 19<sup>th</sup> century composers
- 8% - 18<sup>th</sup> century composers
- 18% - all previous centuries
- 10% - unattributed or undocumented

Of course, there are limitations when anthems are chosen. The primary factor is the music's relevance to that day's Lectionary readings, and the copies must either be purchased or already present in the choral library at the church in order to be good stewards of our resources. But even so, the choices represent a decidedly contemporary slant. Since the numbers above refer only to what was sung by the Emmanuel Choir at the 9 AM offertory, the results don't include music for special services (Christmas, Easter,) children's choir, Youth Sunday offerings, or what is sung at summer services. If those were to be factored in, we think you'll agree that the musical offerings span quite a wide range of styles and interests in our effort to speak to the hearts of worshippers, who may be moved by very different types of music.

## WOMEN OF EMMANUEL GARDEN PARTY!

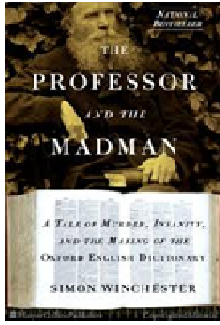

Congratulations to **Andrew Shipp** and the girls lacrosse team at Cor Jesu Academy for winning the State Championship Saturday, May 21.

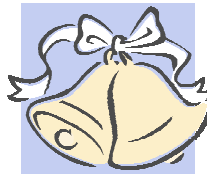

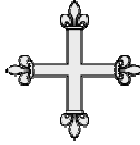
