Dear Friends,

Seven years ago, on June 15, 2009, I wrote my first letter to you the people of Emmanuel. In it I shared with you a story by Robert Raines that I am fond of. It is found in his book *Creative Brooding*, and it embraces the creative process that can occur in life when we are reflective about the opportunities we face.

The story is about the Inuit ivory carvers of Alaska and Northern Canada. Raines says that each of these artists would take a piece of ivory, and rather than rushing off and cutting into the ivory with his knife, would take days to examine it and meditate on it. The community’s traditions say that each carver would hold the ivory gently in their hands and turning it back and forth in the light would say, "Who are you? Who lies within you?" It is only after they received their answer that the artist would take knife to ivory and cut.

When I arrived here, I shared with you this story and tried to ask those questions of the parish so that we could to explore “who you were” as a Christian community. I met with you in committee meetings and informal groups. Members of the Vestry and staff talked with me about your ministries, the six “Core Values” you had developed, your parish survey and your vision/mission statement. All of these conversations were wonderful ways to discover where your focus was and where your passions lay. Those dialogues revealed the potential of “what was within you,” longing to be born in mission and ministry. And, even as that interaction was occurring, I was asking myself, who I was in your midst, and what was it that I might become with you in this new place and time.

I believe that engaging in that reflection process, and the one you engaged in before my arrival, helped us to grow together in order to imagine what ministries we might create together. It was very clear to me that Emmanuel was a vital and welcoming community where ministry is shared, nurtured and supported by not only the staff and lay leadership of the parish – but by everyone!



Vestry Reflection by Dave Loyet

Sara and I both retired late in the year of 2014. To celebrate we took a trip in 2015 to New York City and Paris with a Road Scholar barge tour through the champagne region.

It was a wonderful, exciting, and memorable trip. We toured champagne houses, sampled a lot of cheeses, ate some fantastic meals, saw a lot of churches with stained glass windows and visited art museums. However, the main focus of the tour was educational. We visited several World War I American cemeteries, memorials, and monuments. It was a very moving experience to see thousands of headstones of the men who made the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom and for the freedom of the citizens of a foreign county. Their sacrifice was the ultimate demonstration of love for others. This tour was very inspirational.

But, the most inspirational and emotional part of our trip was in New York City when we visited the 911 Memorial Fountain and Museum. Seeing the Memorial Fountain was a spiritual experience. The victims' names are etched in brass surrounding the fountain. Underneath the brass you could touch the water that flowed to the center internal fall that appeared to be an endless black void ... it seemed as though you could reach their spirits by touching the water.

The 911 Museum is exceptional. There were a lot of displays. There were twisted girders. There was the freedom stairway where many of the survivors escaped. There was a blue wall of art with close to 100 small paintings of shades of blue which tried to capture the blue sky of that day. There was a firetruck and a memorial to firemen. There were pictures of the victims and first responders. We went all around the perimeter of the museum in about 3 hours, and we thought that we were finished. We weren't.

We noticed that there was a room in the middle that we hadn't visited. It was the audio visual section that contained a huge collection of material ... the sights and sounds of terror, heroism, sacrifice, love, and hope. We couldn't complete the whole circuit. After an hour we were just too emotionally exhausted to continue. The recording that hit me hardest was a cell phone voicemail message from Brian David Sweeney to his wife Julie. He was a passenger on Flight 175 which crashed into the South Tower, the second plane that hit the towers. This is a transcript of that message:

"Jules, this is Brian. Listen, I'm on an airplane that's been high-jacked. If things don't go well, and it's not looking good. I just want you to know I absolutely love you ... I want you to do good, go have good times, same to my parents and everybody ... And I just totally love you ... And I'll see you when you get there. Bye Babe! I hope I call you."

I found it amazing that he had the presence of mind to process information so quickly and to calmly spend the last moments of his life to tell his wife to enjoy her life and that they would meet again.

I would recommend that everyone should visit the memorial and museum at least once, but be prepared emotionally.

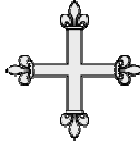

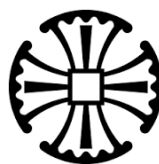
