ANNOUNCEMENT FROM WARDENS & VESTRY

July 1, 2016

Dear Members and Friends of Emmanuel:

On behalf of the Vestry, we are happy to announce that the Rev. Doris C. Westfall has been called to be Interim Rector of Emmanuel Episcopal Church beginning September 1, 2016. Doris' first career was as a social worker at St. Louis Society for the Blind and Visually Impaired where she rose to become Director of Programs and Services. She also served as adjunct assistant professor of field instruction at St. Louis University School of Social Service. She earned her BA in 1981 from Valparaiso University and her Master of Social Work degree from St. Louis University in 1993. Once Doris discerned her call to the ministry, she earned her Master of Divinity degree in 2005 from the University of the South, where she now serves as a trustee.

Doris is an experienced, confident, nurturing priest. She is outgoing and friendly. She is very spiritually grounded and loves to help others grow and develop as Christ's people. She looks forward to sharing in our communal life.

She has served many Episcopal parishes as Interim Rector or long-term supply priest, including Grace Church, Clarksville, MO; St. John's, Eolia, MO; St. Matthew's Church, Mexico, MO; Holy Trinity Church, Sulphur, LA; and St. Luke's, Manchester, MO, where she is currently serving. Additionally, Doris was Pastoral Assistant for Trinity St. Charles, MO; Interim Priest for Episcopal Campus Ministry at Washington University; and Rector at St. Matthew's, Warson Woods. At St. Matthew's, she led the discernment process that resulted in the parish's merger with Grace Episcopal Church in Kirkwood.

Doris will conclude her ministry at St. Luke's on July 31, take the month of August off to refresh and attend to some family matters, and then she will join us at Emmanuel on September 1. In the meantime, we have provided for preaching and pastoral care through our existing clergy during July and August. Our regular Sunday worship schedule will continue: 8:00, 10:00, and 5:30, and you will continue to see familiar clergy faces.



Trinity Food Ministry Receives Grant From United Thank Offering

The United Thank Offering of the Episcopal Church awarded **32 grants** for a total of **\$1,161,314.62** for the mission and ministry of The Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion. The announcement was made by Executive Council, meeting June 8-June 10 in Chaska, MN.

A ministry to promote thankfulness and mission in the whole Church, UTO grants are awarded for projects that address human needs and help alleviate poverty, both domestically and internationally in the Episcopal Church.

The 2016 grants were awarded to projects in 32 dioceses, six companion dioceses, one grant to the Office of the Presiding Bishop - Episcopal Migration Ministries, and one Presiding Bishop Grant.

In the Diocese of Missouri, Trinity Food Ministry at Trinity Church Central West End in St. Louis received a grant of \$3,112.00 for *Feeding Our Community*.

Several of you have offered your assistance. Fear not! We are keeping a list and providing names to those heading up the sub-committees. Things are starting slowly, as we are spending time gathering information for budgets, time-frames and more so you may not hear from anyone until the fall!



Those of you who are here on Sundays know that during the summer we will be adding some history highlights. Below is what will be in the July 10 Sunday Announcements.

The earliest memorial window in the church is in memory of Maurice Dwight Blaine. Maurice was born October 23, 1850 and died August 27, 1866. This window is now in the chapel and is a three-fold design: crown, cross with thorns, and IHS. It was placed in the church in 1867. Maurice was a friend of the Lockwood boys and often visited them at their summer home down the road from Emmanuel. The boys would hunt on the property and they liked to visit the construction of the new church. On August 27, 1866, Maurice tripped on the Lockwood's front step and his shotgun went off killing him. His parents, knowing of his interest in the church being erected by the Lockwood family, gave the window in his memory.



The original Lockwood Home currently serves as the Administration offices for Nerinx Hall High School. It is hidden behind the newer brick buildings that face Lockwood. It's worth a walk up the drive some day to see it!

This window also has a lovely grapevine border. A replica of that border could make a very pretty sun catcher.

She is currently at St. Louis Rehab Institute and is progressing every day! Anna is the daughter of Dore Peak Gruener and Skip & Renee Martin. The Who, What, When, How..... of Emmanuel's Prayer Shawl Ministry!

Hard as it is to believe, it's been over ten years since a group of knitters at Emmanuel started making prayer shawls to be distributed to those going through a hard time due to illness, loss, or other crises. The shawls are knitted (or occasionally crocheted) with love by the group members, blessed by one of our priests, and given to those who need them. The shawls wrap the individuals in God's love and the caring of Emmanuel. Over 200 shawls have been given out to date.

A couple of years after starting to make prayer shawls, the group decided to make blankets for those who are baptized. Now every person baptized in the parish receives a colorful blanket, handmade and blessed. Over 120 of these baptismal gifts have been distributed.

The group has also sent hand knitted and crocheted items to the Rosebud Reservation; the military; Nurses for Newborns; Save the Newborns; Garden of Innocents; St. Andrews; Lydia's House; the homeless; and the Board of Religious Organizations.

If you would like to be a part of this ministry, you are welcome to join us in the Parish Hall on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Thursday of each month from 7:00 to 8:00 PM for knitting, crocheting and fellowship. And if you don't know how to knit or crochet but would like to learn, we can help you with that too!

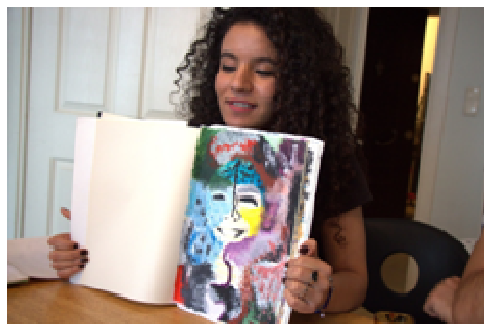

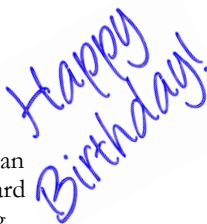

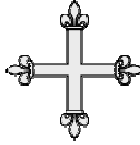
