We will make a weekend of it!

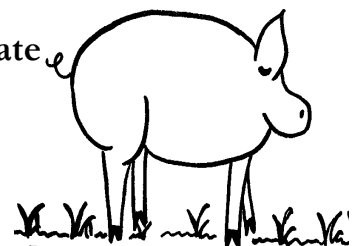
Friday, September 9, Women of Emmanuel will hold a social starting at 5:30 p.m.

[Update from Missions Committee](#)

Earlier this week, the Missions Committee, on behalf of the congregation, unanimously approved the transfer of \$5,000.00 to the Diocese of Missouri/Companion Diocese Committee. These funds, generously donated by the people of Emmanuel, were originally ear marked for grinding mills for the people in the Diocese of Lui. However, as the result of a resumption of civil war and continued attempts at genocide of the Moru people, residents of Lui have been forced to flee. While some are hiding in the bush, many sought safety at a refugee camp in Kampala, Uganda.

Bishop Smith and his wife, Debbie, met in May in Kampala with friends from Lui, as well as with our missionary partners from the Diocese of Lund, Sweden. While the refugee camp provides a measure of safety, there are inherent risks that come along with so many people living together in less than ideal circumstances.

No doubt, many of you have read about ‘sand jiggers’ or ‘sand fleas’ –a parasitic insect found in most tropical and sub-tropical climates. While it is native to Central and South America, it has been introduced to sub-Saharan Africa. These fleas burrow under the skin, causing infection, ulcerations and resulting wounds that lead to hepatitis, gangrene and sometimes amputation. Prevention is through utilization of things we take for granted – soap, water, topical ointments (such as Neosporin and Vaseline) and shoes. The humanitarian crisis facing the Moru people in the refugee camp demands a response from the people who have actively partnered with them in the past: those of us who have visited in each other’s homes, laughed, prayed and worked together.

At this time, providing grinding mills is not an option through which we can support our friends in Lui. Yet they are still in need of our prayers, financial support and contributions to their wellbeing. As their situation has changed so must the focus of our efforts change. With the planning and leadership of our Companion Diocesan Committee, shoes, topical ointment and medication will be bought in bulk and shipped to our partners in the camp in Kampala for distribution to the Moru people in exile. Emmanuel’s contribution will hopefully serve as ‘seed money’ to encourage other parishes in our Diocese to contribute to this vitally important effort.

There will be an opportunity at the end of August for individual parishioners who want to help with counting, sorting and packing the boxes for shipping. This shipping preparation will take place at All Saints Episcopal Church in North St Louis. Be looking for further announcements!

We also need to let you know that the Missions Committee is reserving almost \$6,000.00, which we will continue to hold in the trust and hope that the people of Lui will be able to return to their homes and re-establish their lives. We appreciate both the parish's’ flexibility to respond to changing circumstances and your long-term commitment to our friends in our companion Diocese.

Please continue to keep the people of South Sudan and of our Companion Diocese Committee in your prayers.

Welcome Wafaa Abu Elula



On Tuesday, July 26, 2016, Penny and Davis Allen met Wafaa (pronounced wuh-FA) at O’Hare Airport in Chicago and transported her to St. Louis. Wafaa will be living with the Sisters of Loretto, just up the street!

Now that Wafaa is here and people have visited with her face to face we have more details to share with you. First of all, this effort was initiated by a group of people in New York who recently were involved in the “Iraqi Student Project” (ISP). That was a grass-roots effort to help war-displaced students get to the United States for an undergraduate education. Because of the situation in Syria, that organization has been helping in refugee camps throughout eastern Europe. Because of their past work with Iraqi students, ISP has contact at various colleges and universities around the U.S., and know-how for obtaining student visas, etc.

Additionally, Sara Sabaa, one of the first Iraqi students ISP worked with attended Webster University and is now working on a graduate degree there and has a full-time job at a locally headquartered IT firm. Sara will be taking over the leadership of the Wafaa support group.

After meeting and talking with Wafaa, Davis Allen offered these comments. “It may be tempting to refer to Wafaa as a “refugee,” because she and her family have not been completely in control of the timing of their departure from Syria (almost 4 years ago) or Turkey. Also, the members of her family have been separated because governments have forced them to do so. (Both of her parents and a younger sister are in Sweden; the oldest sister is in Fulton, MO, and another younger sister is in college in Istanbul.) Since the time when Wafaa was born 22 years ago, she or members of her family have lived in Syria, Uganda, Cuba, Sweden, Syria again, Turkey, and the U.S. Her parents’ parents escaped Palestine in 1948 after the 1947 war, so Wafaa has never been there, but culturally the family considers itself to be Palestinian. Wafaa has spent most of her life in Syria, but she has also lived in several other countries in pursuit of goals and dreams ... she considers herself a Palestinian-Syrian *student* who has newly arrived to America. There’s a lot more to her story, but we want to be sure she’s allowed to tell it in the proper context.”

This weekend Wafaa is going to Westminster College to visit her sister and is very excited about that. In the coming weeks you will hear more from the Women of Emmanuel who have agreed to be involved in helping support Wafaa. 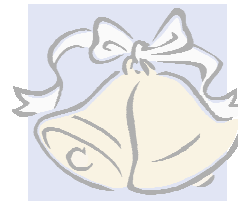
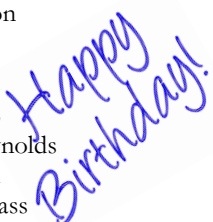

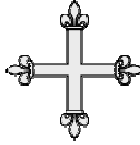
