The Rev. Doris C. Westfall was ordained an Episcopal Priest in 2005 when she completed her Master of Divinity degree at the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee. Her first clergy position was at St. James Episcopal Church in Sewanee. From 2005-2007, she served as a long-term Supply Priest for two rural, yoked Missouri congregations---Grace Church-Clarksville and St. John's-Eolia. She has gone on to serve as Interim Priest for the Episcopal Campus Ministry at Washington University in St. Louis, Pastoral Assistant for Trinity Episcopal Church in St. Charles, Missouri, Rector for six years for the former St. Matthew's Episcopal Church in Warson Woods, Missouri, Interim Rector for Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Sulphur, Louisiana, and Interim Rector for St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Manchester, Missouri.

Prior to her ordination, the Rev. Westfall was a Social Worker, having earned her Master of Social Work in 1993 from St. Louis University, and her Bachelor of Arts in 1981 from Valparaiso University in Valparaiso, Indiana. She was associated with the St. Louis Society for the Blind and Visually Impaired from 1990 until 2002, first as a Social Worker and then as Director of Programs and Services. Concurrently, she served as Adjunct Assistant Professor of Field Instruction at the St. Louis University School of Social Service. She was awarded the prestigious Social Worker of the Year award in 1999 by the National Association of Social Workers—Missouri Chapter, and in 1997 she was nominated for St. Louis University's Outstanding Field Instructor of the Year award.

Nominations Call for Leadership Positions

The 177th Diocesan Convention (Nov. 18 & 19, 2016) will elect lay members and clergy to governance bodies including Diocesan Council, Standing Committee, Disciplinary Board, Cathedral Chapter, and this year to the Missouri deputation (8 deputies and 8 alternates) to the 79th General Convention of the Episcopal Church to be held in July 2018 in Austin, Texas. The Nominations Committee of this diocese is charged with finding three candidates to stand for election for each of this year's 26 open positions.



Are you called to serve in this ministry of leadership?

Have you somone in your congregation or this diocese to recommend?

Cathedral Chapter

- Electing 1 clergy & 1 lay member both from within St. Louis City/County
- 3 yr term, monthly meetings at the Cathedral
- is the legal governing and decision-making body of the cathedral, consisting of elected lay representatives of the congregation, elected at-large representatives from the Diocese of Missouri and ex-officio members. (In a parish this body is called a vestry.) Its duties include approving the budget and making policy.

General Convention Deputation

- Electing 8 deputies & 8 alternates, in each group 4 lay members & 4 clergy
- 3 year term
- the 79th General Convention of the Episcopal Church will meet in July 2018 in Austin, TX.
- In addition to attending the House of Deputies, duties during the meeting, the deputation studies proposed legislation and listens to concerns of the diocese before, and reports back to the diocese after General Convention meets.

Diocesan Council

- · Electing 2 lay members
- 3 year term, meets 6 times a year, *
 at least once each quarter, currently on Saturdays.
- Carries out the work of diocesan convention between annual * meetings, prepares and oversees the budget, develops and reviews diocesan programs. It consists of elected (by convention and convocation) and appointed mem-
- Functions as the Corporation of the Diocese.

Standing Committee

- Electing 2 clergy & 1 lay member
- 4 year term, meets monthly, currently last Thursday of month, 5-7 PM at St. Martin's in Ellisville
- Functions as the council of advice to the Bishop, is a visioning group for the diocese. Certifies candidates for ordination in this diocese and votes on consent to the election, ordination, and consecration of bishops churchwide. May serve as ecclesiastical authority for the diocese in the absence of a bishop.

Disciplinary Board

- Electing 1 lay member & 2 clergy
- 4 year term, meets as needed, at least once each year after convention for training and to elect a president.
- Exists to help in cases where clergy have been presented with charges under the Ecclesiastical Disciplinary Canons (Title IV) of Episcopal Church Canons. If a presentment arises the DB president along with the bishop will review the work of the Intake Officer to determine need for further investigation. Depending on investigation's outcome, DB may work in two groups, one that would seek conciliation, the other to serve as a trial court should a case go that far.


