*The Interim Rector’s Ramblings*

Dear Friends:

What a pleasure it is to be with you! In this article I would like to introduce myself a little bit more as well as tell you about my approach to ministry and how I look at interim ministry in particular. I share my life with my husband and best friend of 24 years, David, who is an Intelligence Analyst for the Department of Defense. We are the parents of three sons: Christopher, who is a Captain in the Air Force and stationed in Minot, North Dakota; Stephen, who graduated Mizzou in May and has moved to Scottsdale, Arizona to take a position with Vanguard Group, the financial services company; and Robert, a junior at University of Central Missouri majoring in Criminal Justice. We also are “parents” to three cats and a 12-week-old Teddy Roosevelt Terrier by the name of Denny. I love to cook, read, and travel when time allows. I am a life-long Episcopalian, baptized in the Diocese of Newark, confirmed in the Diocese of New Jersey, married in the Diocese of Northern Indiana, and ordained in the Diocese of Missouri!

I believe that ministry is relational. It starts with the relationship we have first with God in Christ and extends to all of humanity, as well as all of creation. It is in relationship that we live our faith out in the world. Faith is always personal, but for a Christian it can never be private. We are called to share the love of God with those in our families and communities. The early church was known as “The Way” and those that followed Jesus were called “People of the Way.” Christianity wasn’t just a set of beliefs; it was a way of life lived out purposefully and intentionally. Those that followed Jesus lived a very different life than the surrounding culture.

It is because of this relational orientation that I will spend the next few months just getting to know who you are, who Emmanuel believes itself to be as a community of faith, and to develop relationships and understandings about this place and its people. We are already connected in our relationship with Christ; we are not strangers but rather brothers and sisters in Christ.

Interim Ministry is a unique ministry that looks at ways to help a church identify its core values and develop a vision from them. Everything a church does, every decision a parish makes, should be grounded in and point to the core values of that parish. Interim times are often times of anxiety for a parish, and part of the job of an interim is to manage that anxiety and direct it into healthy and creative opportunities. I liken interim ministry to doing Pilates—it takes the instability of the body and with learning new moves and positions strengthens the core while at the same time stretching and increasing the flexibility. What you have at the end is a toned, tightened, increasingly flexible, and graceful body! My job as your interim is to help you do just that—identify ways and help Emmanuel learn new things that will strengthen it and fill it with God’s grace. I love what I do and I hope that comes through in everything I do every day. I look forward to our work together.

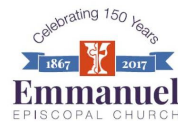
### Women’s Bible Study

Dear Supporter of Webster-Rock Hill Ministries,

It is an exciting time as the expansion and renovation of the Webster-Rock Hill Ministries building nears completion. We are writing today ask for your help in finishing this critical project.

Over the last several months, we have expanded our building to include an enlarged food pantry, a substantial multi-purpose room, and facilities for Radio63119. In addition, we have been able to upgrade the siding and roofing of the old building thanks to donated materials. We look forward to serving those in need with these enhanced facilities.

Unfortunately, we have encountered several unforeseen issues late in the construction process that have driven up costs considerably. The most significant surprise was the discovery of an old house foundation on the location of the new parking lot. The house foundation had to be removed and soil filled and stabilized before the parking lot could be installed. Given the required size of the lot, removal and stabilization was our only option. Soil issues, some additional labor costs, and several unanticipated requirements from the City of Webster Groves have also driven costs above our initial estimates.

Due to these late complications, we need to raise an additional \$20,000. **We need your help to finish this task and enhance our services to those in need in our community.** We ask for your support and the support of your congregation to propel us across the finish line.
