DID YOU KNOW.....

At a recent staff meeting our Interim Rector, Doris Westfall, said she believes there’s a reason most churches have their name. And it becomes their identity, legacy, ministry, etc.

Emmanuel means “God with us”

As we begin celebrations for our 150th Anniversary we hope to share with everyone not only more history also about the ministries and how we have been shaped in the preceding 150 years.

“Until the end of the Civil War there were only a few homes and Augustus Moody’s store in the area now called Webster Groves. The streets were once Indian trails, traversed by the Prairie Indians—the Osage, the Missouri, and the Dakota, who called this area “Dry-Ridge” since it lay between the Meramec and Deer Creek, a branch of the Des Peres. They used this high ridge on their travels in and out of St. Louis because it was dry and free from surprise attack. Big Bend was just a trail in 1840—it led toward the big bend in the Meramec River at Osage Hill where water might be obtained. This trail was an important part of the settlement of Old Orchard and Selma before the railroad came through.”

This is the beginning paragraph written by Dorothy and Charles Rehkopf in the history of Emmanuel written in 1966. How befitting that our Adult Mission Trips go each year to Rosebud Reservation in South Dakota. Here’s a Lakota Prayer from one of those trips:

Teach me how to trust
my heart,
my mind,
my intuition,
my inner knowing,
the sense of my body,
the blessings of my spirit.

Teach me to trust these things
so that I may enter my Sacred Space
and love beyond my fear,
and thus Walk in Balance
with the passing of each glorious Sun.

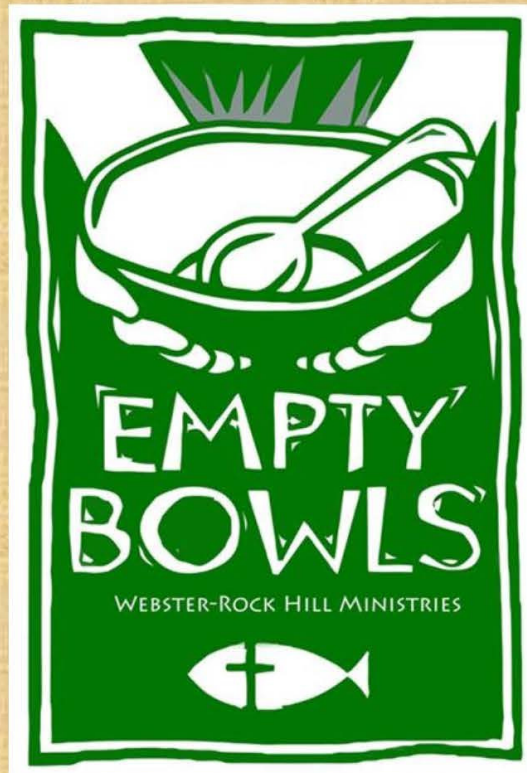
Women's Bible Study

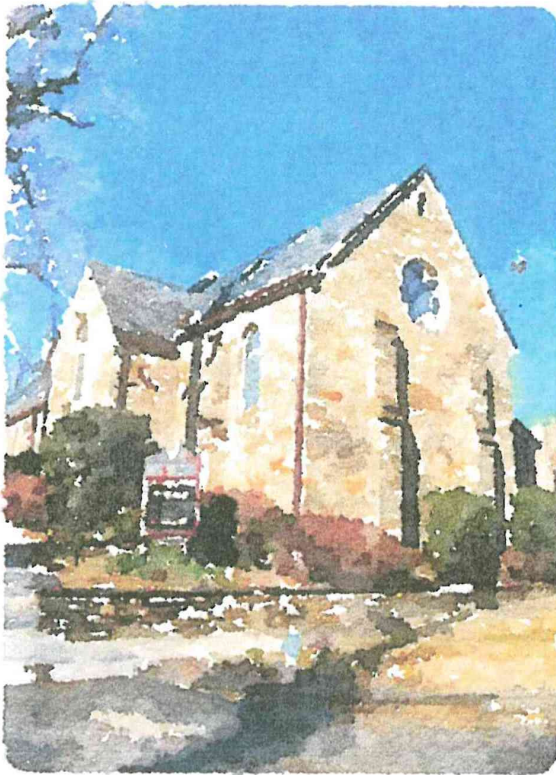
Fall family fun! Pumpkin Carving and Hot Dog Roast

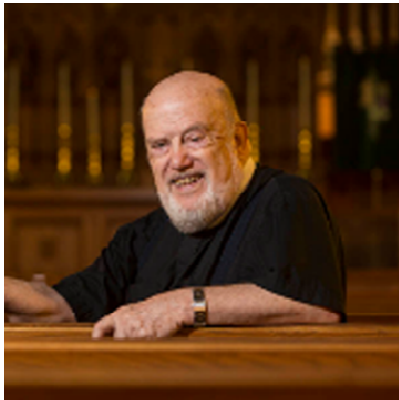

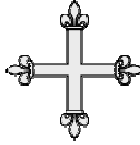
