Dear Friends,

Lions, tigers, and bears. Oh my! Often we walk through life with the same sense of fear that Dorothy and her companions did in the Wizard of Oz. As if all around us were threats and creatures that sought to destroy us on our journey. Politicians, ISIS, and civil unrest. Oh my! While our fears are legitimate and a natural part of our daily lives, the capacity they have to overpower us often comes down to our decision to see darkness instead of light. My prayer today is that the words of the Gospel will encourage you as you journey through your fear into a new place of liberation.

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." – John 1:5

If you would please, take out a pen or pencil. In the margin of this newsletter, write down something that scares you, something of which you are truly afraid. Then ask yourself, "Why am I afraid of this? Why does this have power over me?" Nine times out of ten, the things that we fear most are those things of which we know very little. Very rarely will an entomologist write down spiders or a race car driver write down speed. This is largely because fear is a product of the unknown, the unstudied, the unexperienced. We fear that which we do not know.

Even one of the most common phrases that is associated with fear, and magic, and witches actually comes from something beautiful. Many of you know the phrase "Hocus Pocus." But did you know that this phrase is actually a misunderstood pronunciation of our Eucharistic Prayer? Allow me to explain. Hundreds of years ago, when the mass was said exclusively in Latin, the priest would say, "Hoc est corpus meum" meaning "This is my body." The wonder and unexplainable nature of transubstantiation (turning the bread and wine into the literal body and blood of Christ) led many to associate this prayer with magic. After all, something magical and transcendent was happening in that moment, something they did not fully understand. Years later, we have come to associate this phrase with witches and dark magic as misunderstanding gave way to the fear of the unknown. But now, we who know the true meaning of this phrase know that its true meaning and intention is an act of love, not something to be feared, but something to be exalted.

As we find ourselves in the midst of the Halloween season, I encourage you all to embrace something that scares you. Learn about it. Know its positive counter-part. And seek to replace fear with courage.

For an example of how to do this, look to the saints who faced the unknown with a fervor for life and for the Gospel, who stood against danger and misunderstanding and said, light is greater than darkness.

What is City Streets?

City Streets is how Emmanuel participates in AmeriCorps' Emergency Winter Warming Shelter. AmeriCorps St. Louis started this emergency shelter 6 years ago at the urgent request of the City Department of Human Services during a particularly bitter winter. When the temperature dips below 20 °F, AmeriCorps opens its doors on the weekends to provide a bed and food to people living on the streets. To prepare for potentially bitter cold nights, Emmanuelites meet various Sundays between November and February to prepare meals, freeze them, and take to AmeriCorps to use when the shelter is open. AmeriCorps is one of several partners with St. Louis Winter Outreach to assist those living on the streets in St. Louis. On Sunday, October 23, the 150th Anniversary Committee provided an update on plans for the parish. In a nutshell here's what is in your future!

We started our celebrations slowly in March 2016 in order to coordinate with the other three churches celebrating 150 years at the same time. Emmanuel's building was started in 1866 but was consecrated in 1867. So we typically celebrate a year after Webster Groves Presbyterian, First Congregational, and Old Community Missionary Baptist. These four churches elected to celebrate by giving to our community. And we did that by taking on an expansion program for Webster-Rock Hill Ministries. Emmanuel raised over \$50,000 in 2016 to support that effort, and on October 16, 2016, Webster-Rock Hill Ministries hosted an open house for the community in their newly renovated building.

We are now solidly in Phase 2 of our own celebrations, which kicked off Sunday, October 23, with a fabulously fun Road Rally! Take a peek on page 5 for the team results!

We will continue to celebrate by Honoring the Past, Celebrating the Present, and Giving to the Future. These three overarching committees are planning to

- Create a cookbook for sale that will include the best of the past and present!
- Create, for sale, Emmanuel mementos or keepsakes. This effort is just beginning; we'll report more later.
- Produce a pictorial directory. That means we will have our photos taken next summer!
- On April 22, 2017, we will have a Bold in Mission Service Blitz. That means we will have ways for all of us to engage in outreach and service.
- On October 21, 2017, we will have a final celebratory dinner, and on Sunday, October 23, 2017, Bishop Smith will be here.


