Rest, Reflect, Reassess, Renew, Recalibrate

Dear Friends:

As we approach the summer season and its more relaxed pace, it hit me that summer time and an interim time share many of the same characteristics. Both are a time to REST. Everyone occasionally needs to step back from normal routines, breathe more deeply, play more intentionally, and take things at a slower pace so that the body and mind can enter into a new time, a holy time, a time that God even took for God’s Self on the seventh day of creation. We cannot function, let alone function well, without recognizing that REST is imperative to our health, both as individual bodies as well as a corporate body. Our culture does everything it can to seduce us into not resting, into thinking the only way to be successful is to be frenetically busy; to do more, accomplish more, show more for our efforts. But God tells us to come away and rest awhile, to spend more time in Jesus’ presence. That is where true refreshment and new life will be found.

If we do not REST we cannot take the time to REFLECT. This is one of the holiest and most important tasks before us, the body of Christ. To rest in God’s promises allows us to reflect on what is important in our lives and in our faith community. Reflecting is taking the time to re-center and ask ourselves if we are living into the vision that God has for us corporately. Reflecting allows us to ask the hard questions, to look at our life together in gratitude and hopefulness, and to focus on God “in whom we live and move and have our being.” Reflecting grounds us for the work ahead and roots all our efforts in God’s will for us not our will for our life together.

Summertime and an interim time allow us to REASSESS who we are and what God wants for our life together. Reassessing allows us to look at what is working, what is not working, what changes may need to be made or if new ways of doing things need to be tried. Every summer I go through my closet and look at what I can and can’t fit into any more (and as the years go by this latter category seems to be growing!), what I still like but can no longer wear (regardless of how much I want to!), and what may need to be gifted or given away. I ask myself if there are things I can still use but need to consider doing so in new ways. Reassessing allows us to clean out, spruce up, and get creative.

REASSESSING also allows us to RENEW those things that truly matter. By focusing time and energy into who we truly are and what we are called to be we

are authentically living into our God-given purpose. We more fully become the people and the Body of Christ that God has intended for us. We are literally made new again.

Taking the time to REST, REFLECT, REASSESS, and RENEW, we then need to RECALIBRATE our settings! Perhaps to say we need to REBOOT is also accurate. How are we going to live differently, what are we going to be doing differently with what we have learned by taking the time to REST, REFLECT, REASSESS, and RENEW? To RECALIBRATE is to put into place those disciplines and practices that will bring about the new life God has promised to us.

My prayers for all of you individually as well as for our life together through my remaining interim at Emmanuel are that we will allow ourselves this sacred opportunity to live into this holy time and space.

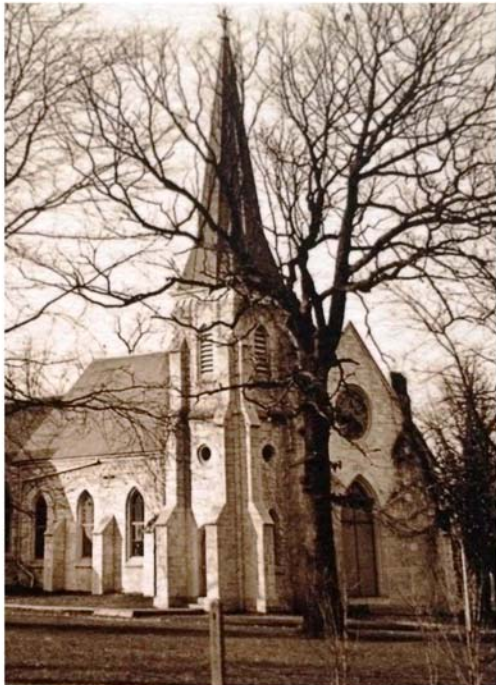

Speaking of one of the projects—HVAC

You may notice it is warmer than usual in the sanctuary and the dining room this summer.

When we switched from heating to cooling this spring it was discovered that one of two the large compressors was not kicking on. After investigation, we learned it needed to be replaced. The cost to replace it is approximately \$6,000. The larger of the two compressors *is* working. But, as it gets warmer we will notice it is not able to keep both the sanctuary and the dining room at the cooling level of two compressors!

This is equipment that will be replaced in the fall using the campaign funds being raised. We are trying to balance the need for comfort and the need for fiscal responsibility. We think this is a reasonable balance that will get us through the summer until our HVAC Phase I needs will be dealt with.

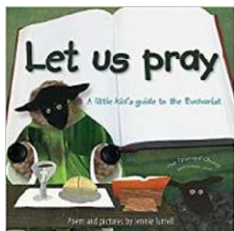
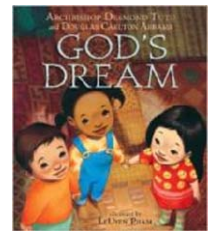

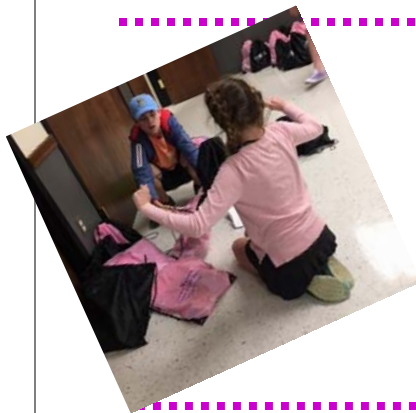
As our **Sr. High Youth and their leaders** head to Antigua, Guatemala, please keep them in your prayers.

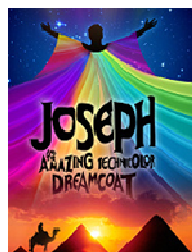

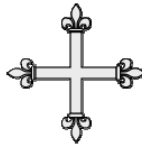
