


Vision Movie Screening - June 17

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT MINISTRY

Help continue our ministry to international students this summer

This summer, we have a special opportunity to support the international students in our community during a difficult time. In 2023, Rev. Susanna Clive began working with Webster University students from Nepal, India, Pakistan, China, and parts of Africa — many of whom face limited job options and make do with very little.

Now, several students attend Emmanuel on Sundays, and dozens more visit during the week to pick up culturally familiar food staples. Susanna also helps them when personal emergencies arise.

While the students typically return home over

the summer, many are staying this year due to concerns that they may not be permitted to reenter the country. With your help, Susanna and the International Student Ministry Committee hope to continue offering food, emergency assistance, and care throughout the summer.

Emmanuel's Faith in Action Committee has generously committed to covering the cost of one month of the summer program. We will need to raise an additional \$4,400 to continue the program through the rest of the summer. Gifts of any amount are welcome.
