


### Homecoming and Ministry Fair 2025 on 9/21

# **EPISCOPAL IDENTITY NEWS**



Dear Emmanuel family,

This is the first in a short series of articles answering some often-heard questions on issues of membership in our church and Episcopal polity. These are important to clarify ahead of our Annual Parish Meeting in January.

**MEMBERSHIP:** Many of our newcomers have asked how to become a member. The answer is: that depends... Episcopalians need a letter of transfer, which we do from our office upon your request. Transfers from other denominations need only to state their commitment to me to be added to our rolls.

**VOTING:** The Episcopal Church was originally modeled after the newly forming American government, immediately following the Revolutionary War, when establishing our own identity, separate from the British, was crucial. That is why TEC (The Episcopal Church) is bi-cameral: the House of Deputies (priests and lay people) and the House of Bishops (only bishops). This gives the people a voice and vote in the direction of the life of the Church.

Canonical authority in our church has three levels, much like our American culture, each one answering to a higher authority. It looks like this:

Parish governance (vestry and clergy) is akin to
Diocesan governance (Bishop, delegates) is akin to
TEC governance (General Convention) is akin to
Federal level of law

**COMMUNICANT IN GOOD STANDING:** Every January at our Annual Parish Meeting, we vote in new vestry members as well as delegates to diocesan convention. A person must be a "communicant in good standing" to vote. Here is how that is defined in our canons:

CANON I.17.1.d - I.17.4.a-d TITLE I: Communicants Communicants in Good Standing:

**Sec. 3.** All Members of this Church who for the previous year have been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God, are to be considered Communicants in Good Standing.

"Faithful in worship" includes worshiping online with us. "Giving" refers to financial giving, and "faithful working" means participation in ministries of the church.
