They help clients from partner organizations transition to their new living situations with much-needed furnishings and basics, providing a sense of ownership and a source of stability at this crucial time in their lives. This past weekend, HSH's ability to pick up and deliver household items came to an abrupt halt because catalytic converters were stolen from their trucks. Many of these families have already endured significant challenges, fleeing conflict or violence for a chance at a better life.
